the treasurers, or of any of the collectors, or to be collected, be paid in CHAP. to the hands of the intendant of the revenue, for the purpole aforesaid; and so much of the act of April session one thousand seven hundred and eighty-two, entitled, An additional Supplement to the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two, as directs the treasurer of the western shore to send the same to the continental treas tury, or pay the same to order of congress, is hereby repealed.

IV. And be it enacted, That the intendant is hereby authorised and Intendant to empowered to sell so much of the specifics, as are collected in virtue of &c. the act to raise the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eightythree, or of the money received for that part of the tax that may be discharged in specifics, to the amount of thirteen thousand pounds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be applied to the purposes aforesaid.

V. And be it enacted, That the intendant of the revenue may apply May apply so much of the money arising from the sales of property to carry on the recruiting service, and so much of the funds established for the defence of the bay, (not already expended, or necessary to defray the charges already incurred) as may be fully sufficient to discharge the pay due to the officers and soldiers as aforesaid.

VI. And be it enacted, That the intendant shall and may apply so or specifics, much money or specifics, due for taxes before the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two, as shall be necessary for the purpose aforesaid; and if the five shillings specie tax, or the specifics for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-three, should be applied to carry this act into execution, before the debts for arrearages before the year seventeen hundred and eighty-two are received, the intendant shall replace the sum raised from the five shilling specie tax, and the specifics for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-three, out of fuch arrearages.

VII. And ve it enaued, That the intendant may, in his discretion, May sell tofell a quantity not exceeding four hundred hogsheads of tobacco now hand, &c. on hand, for the purpose of carrying this act into execution, and discharging the five months pay aforefaid.

C H A P. XXIII.

An ACT to prohibit the bringing flaves into this state.

E it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be imported, not be lawful, after the passing this act, to import or bring into &c. this state, by land or water, any negro, mulatto, or other slave, for tale, or to reside within this state; and any person brought into this state as a slave contrary to this act, if a slave before, shall thereupon immediately cease to be a slave, and shall be free; provided that this act shall not prohibit any person, being a citizen of some one of the United States, coming into this state, with a bona fide intention of fettling therein, and who shall actually reside within this state for one year at least, to be computed from and next succeeding his coming into the flate, to import or bring in any flave or flaves which before belonged to such person, and which slave or slaves had been an inhabitant
