old or new interlude, tragedy, comedy, opera, play, farce, or other CHAP. entertainment of the stage, or any act, scene, addition, insertion or amendment, or any new prologue or epilogue, before a copy thereof shall be sent as aforesaid, every person so offending shall, for every such offence, forfeit the sum of thirty pounds, and the licence for acting thall be void.

V. And be it enacted, That upon oath, or information lodged be- Fine on actors fore a magistrate, the informant having committed to writing the im- dest words, modest or indecent words sworn to have been spoken by any actor or be. actrels, and having likewise described in writing any indecent or immodest gestures used by any actor or actress in any interlude, tragedy, comedy, opera, play, farce, or other entertainment of the stage, the magistrate shall transmit the information given as aforesaid to the governor, who, if he shall judge the words committed to writing, or gestures described, to be immodest or indecent, he shall direct the attorney-general to profecute the person or persons so offending, and upon conviction thereof, the person or persons so offending shall be fined a fum not exceeding fifteen pounds.

VI. And be it enaced, That no person shall be liable to be prose-Prosecutions cuted for any offence against this act, unless such prosecution shall be to be comcommenced within the space of six calendar months after the offence in 6 months, &c. committed.

VII. This act to continue and be in force for one year, and until Continuance. the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereaster.

An ACT respecting the tonnage of vessels.

THEREAS the tonnage of ships or vessels registered in Preamble. this state are calculated by carpenters measure, by which means the citizens of this state pay a greater tonnage than the citizens of any other state, whose ships or vessels of the same dimensions, registered elsewhere, are estimated differently, or at a much lower tonnage, and consequently the citizens of this state pay heavier duties at foreign ports: For relief therefore, and to place the citizens of this state as nearly as may be upon an equality with the citizens of other states, in foreign ports, as well as in the ports of the United States,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all How tonnage ships or vessels to be registered shall have their tonnage ascertained in is to be ascerthe manner heretofore directed, except in the number to divide by, which shall be two hundred instead of ninety-five; and all ships or vessels under register, the property of a citizen of this state, or one third of which is held by any citizen belonging to this state, may and are hereby authorised to take out new registers, dividing by two hundred, agreeably to this act.

III. And be it enacted, That the tonnage on all registers taken out Rate of tonagreeably to this act for and during the present year, be rated at two shillings per ton, and collected accordingly.
