for other purposes, made at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on Tuesday the seventeenth day of October, seventeen hundred and eighty, be and is hereby revived and continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of one year. That one other act of assembly, entitled, An act to declare what foreign gold and silver coin shall be deemed the current money of this state, made at a session of assembly, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on Monday the fifth day of November, seventeen hundred and eighty-one, be and is hereby continued, and shall be and remain in full force for and during the term of three years, and until the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

C H A P. XXXI.

An ACT to settle and pay the civil list.

Preamble.

WHEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities, and labour to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services,

Officers salaries, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following annual salaries shall be allowed to the several officers of civil government for the current year, to wit: To his Excellency the Governor, one thousand pounds current money; the chancellor, if he shall reside at the seat of government, six hundred pounds; the judges of the general court, each, three hundred and fifty pounds; the judges of the court of appeals, each, one hundred and fifty pounds; the judge of the court of admiralty, one hundred pounds; the treasurer of the western shore, five hundred pounds; the treasurer of the eastern shore, two hundred pounds; the clerk to the governor and council, two hundred pounds; the messenger to the governor and council, seventy-five pounds; the clerk to the senate, seventy-five pounds; the clerk of the house of delegates, one hundred pounds.

Council to be convened by governor, &c.

III. And be it enacted, That the council to the governor be convened by summons, or otherwise, when and as often as the governor (or in case of his absence or inability the president of the council) may think the public business require their deliberations, and that each member of the council, when so convened, shall be allowed the sum of twenty-two shillings and six-pence current money for every day he shall attend in council, or be on his journey to or from the seat of government.

Allowance to delegates to congress, &c.

IV. And be it enacted, That each delegate to congress from this state shall be allowed the sum of thirty-five shillings current money for every day he shall attend, or be on his journey to or from, congress.

C H A P. XXXII.

An ACT to empower Elizabeth Margaret Littig, Philip Littig, and George Littig, to demise the real estate therein mentioned.

WHEREAS the judges of the orphans court for Baltimore county have represented to this general assembly, that a certain Philip Littig, deceased, did leave the said Elizabeth Margaret
