

shall order and direct; and the said trustee shall have full power and authority, after the death of the said George Shipley, senior, in case he should die within seven years, and in a state of infancy, from the passing this act, to complete, and carry into full effect and execution, any contract, engagement, or agreement, which he may make in pursuance of this act, respecting the estate and property of the said George Shipley, senior.

VII. And be it enacted, That the chancellor, on proof to his satisfaction that the said George Shipley, junior, or any other person or persons who may hereafter be appointed by the chancellor, do not faithfully discharge the trust reposed in them respectively, or do not obey all orders which the chancellor shall make respecting the same, the chancellor may remove the person or persons so neglecting to execute the trust aforesaid, and appoint some other person in the place of the person removed; and such person so appointed shall have every power of a trustee, in as full and ample manner as if appointed by this act, first giving bond and security for the faithful execution of the trust aforesaid.

VIII. And be it enacted, That the chancellor may allow unto the said George Shipley, junior, or any person or persons appointed trustee or trustees by the chancellor, such commission or satisfaction for the execution of the trust and powers committed to them, as he may think adequate to their trouble.

C H A P. II.

An ACT to establish a market at the market house in Chester-town, in Kent county, and for the regulation of the said market.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to this general assembly, that the inhabitants of Chester-town and others have erected, on the square appropriated for a market place, a convenient market house, and that if their market was under a proper regulation it might be rendered very useful to them, and the inhabitants of the said county and the adjacent county:

Preamble.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the first day of January, in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, two days in the week shall be set apart, appointed, and held, as market days, within the town of Chester aforesaid, to wit, Wednesday and Saturday; and that all victuals and provision whatsoever, brought to the said town for sale after the aforesaid first day of January in the year aforesaid (except fish and oysters that shall be brought by water, and beef by the quarter or larger quantity, and pork by the hog or hogs, all kinds of grain, flour and bread, butter in firkins or other vessels exceeding twenty pounds net, and cheese, beef and pork in barrels or larger casks, live cattle, sheep and hogs, brought either by land or water) upon those or any other days, shall be carried to the public market house of the said town, there to be sold at the market hours, to wit, from any time in the morning to twelve at noon.

III. And be it enacted, That no person shall presume to buy or cause to be bought, of any person or persons bringing to the said town and within two miles thereof, or having brought any kind of victuals or provisions whatsoever to the said town for sale, except as before excepted, either upon the above stated market days, or any other days of the week during the time of the above stated market hours, at any other place whatsoever but at or in the said market house, under the penalty of fifty shillings current money for every such offence.
