the faid Charles Carroll to take possession of the said land, and also that the petitioner is heir at law to the said Edward Lloyd: And this general assembly esteeming it just and right to secure the title of the said land sto the petitioner, as fully as if a certificate had been returned and patent obtained in consequence of the said contract between the said Edward Lloyd and Charles Carroll, agent aforesaid:

Certificate to be returned, &c.

II. Be it therefore enacted, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the surveyor of Talbot county shall, upon application and request of the said Edward Lloyd, return a certificate of the said land according to its ancient metes and bounds; upon which, and the faid certificate being examined, the chancellor shall have full power and authority to order a patent to be issued for the same land to the said Edward Lloyd the petitioner, his heirs and affigns for ever; in which said patent the payment of the money aforesaid, and the special matter, shall be recited, and the faid patent, so granted, shall have relation to the thirteenth day of May, in the year seventeen hundred and thirteen aforesaid, on which day the money was paid as aforesaid to every intent and purpose, in the same manner as if a certificate had been made out immediately after the money was paid, and a patent had thereupon been granted; and the said certificate shall be returned and patent granted, without burdening the said hdward Lloyd, the petitioner, with the payment of any purchase or compofition money, or any other expence whatever, except the utual and common fees of office to the leveral and respective officers.

C H A P. XV.

An ACT to prevent the obstruction of the navigation of the eastern and north-west branches of the river Patowmack.

Preamble.

HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that great numbers of weirs and hedges have of late been erected in and upon the eastern and north-west branches of Patow-mack river, near the town of Bladensburg, to the great injury of the navigation of the said river and of the trade of the said town: Therefore,

Weirs, &c. may be pulled down, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all weirs and hedges, already made or hereaster to be made, in the eastern and north-west branches of the river Patowmack, which obstruct or hinder the tree navigation thereof, shall be, and are hereby deemed and declared, nuisances, and may be, by any person or persons, pulled down, prossured, and abated, as such.

Not to be erected, &c. III. And he it enalted. That no person or persons whatsoever shall, after the first day of April next, put, place, or make, any weir or hedge, or any other erection, which may injure the navigation in the said eastern or north-west branch of the river Patowmack, under the penalty of five pounds current money for every such offence, to be recovered before any magistrate of the county of Prince-George's, one half to the informar, or him or them that will sue for or protecute to effect for the same, the other half to the use of this state.

Penalty on hihing, &c.

IV. And he it enacted, That any person or persons, who shall fish any such weir or hedge, already exected or which shall hereaster be erected, so as to obstruct or injure the navigation in the said eastern or north-west branch of the said river Patowmack, shall forseit and pay for every such offence the sum of three pounds current money, to be recovered and applied as herein before directed.
