and widening the faid lane, and also to ascertain and determine the sum CHAP. or sums which any or every person interested therein and benefited thereby shall pay, in satisfaction of the said damages; which said tums, if afcertained by a jury as aforesaid, shall be returned by the commissioners, and be recovered in the same manner as before directed.

An ACT for the benefit of Anne Stevenson.

THEREAS Anne Stevenson, wife of doctor Henry Steven-Preamble. ion, by her humble petition to this general affembly hath fet forth, that in consequence of the seizure and sale of a considerable part of the real and personal property of her husband, she is reduced to the painful situation of approaching ruin; that from her sex she had it not in her power, if in her inclination, by any acts of hers, to draw down upon herself and children so heavy a judgment from her country, as a total loss of all the property of her husband; that a small real estate in Somerset county, which she inherited from her father, a life estate in Harford county, which her husband held as tenant by the courtely, in consequence of his marriage with his first wife, and a few negroes, lately the property of her faid husband, are still unsold; and prayed that this general assembly would consider the distressed state of herself and children, and restore to her the estate which he inherited from her father, and such parts of her husband's as to them should feem reasonable; and this general affembly have thought proper to grant the prayer of the laid petitioner: Therefore,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all the Negroes, &c. negroes, late the property of Henry Stevenson, which remain unfold, be given to A. and they are hereby given to the said Anne Stevenson, for her sole and separate use, together with the life estate of her husband in the tract of land in Somerset county, called Providence, containing three hundred and seventy-five acres of land.

III. And he it enacted, That the life estate in the tract of land in Har-Life estate ford county, called Cohiers Lot, to which the said Henry Stevenson was given to chilentitled, in consequence of his marriage with his first wife, be and it is hereby given to the children of the said Henry Stevenson by his said first wife, to be equally divided between them.

IV. And be it enacted. That the faid Anne Stevenson is hereby autho- A. Stevenson rifed to receive any rents that may be due on the estate in Somerset county may receive of the faid Henry Stevenson.

V. Provided always, and he it enacted, That if there should not be provise. sufficient property of the said Henry Stevenson sold to pay all his just debts, that then and in such case all the property given by virtue of this act shall be subject to and remain bound for the payment thereof.
