current year, to wit: His excellency the governor, one thousand pounds; the chancellor, if he shall reside at the seat of government, six hundred and fifty pounds; the judges of the general court, each, five hundred pounds; the judges of the court of appeals, each, two hundred pounds; the judge of the court of admiralty, two hundred and fifty pounds; the treasurer of the western shore, five hundred pounds; the treasurer of the eastern shore, two hundred and fifty pounds; the clerk of the council, two hundred and fifty pounds; the messenger to the council, seventy-five pounds; the clerk of the senate, seventy-five pounds; the clerk of the house of delegates, one hundred pounds; the clerk of the court of appeals, thirty pounds; the printer to the state, five hundred pounds.

To be paid
quarterly, &c.

III. **And be it enacted,** That the said salaries shall be paid quarterly, out of the supplies raised every year, until the general assembly shall make other provision for payment; and the said salaries for the current year shall be paid out of the arrearages of the taxes due for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-four.

Salaries to in-
tendant, &c.

IV. **And be it enacted,** That the several officers following shall be allowed and paid at the rate of the following salaries for the current year, to wit: The intendant of the revenue, five hundred pounds; the intendant's deputy, two hundred and fifty pounds; the deputy to the treasurer of the western shore, two hundred and fifty pounds; the auditor-general, four hundred and fifty pounds; the deputy auditor, one hundred and seventy-five pounds.

To be paid
quarterly, &c.

V. **And be it enacted,** That the said salaries shall be paid quarterly, out of the arrearages of the taxes due for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-four, and if deficient, out of the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-five.

Allowance to
delegates to
congress, &c.

VI. **And be it enacted,** That each delegate to congress from this state shall be allowed three pounds current money per day, for every day he shall attend or be on his journey to or from congress, in full satisfaction for all expences; and this allowance shall be constantly paid out of any public money in the treasury not specially appropriated to other purposes.

Commission to
intendant, &c.

VII. **And be it enacted,** That a commission of one and a half per cent. be allowed to the intendant of the revenue on the sales of any confiscated British property sold by him in virtue of the law passed this present session of assembly.

Council to be
convened on
summons, &c.

VIII. **And be it enacted,** That the council to the governor for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-five be convened by summons or otherwise, when and as often as the governor (or in case of his absence the president of the council) may think the public business requires their attendance; and that each member be allowed thirty shillings current money for every day he shall attend in council, or be on his journey to or from council; and the said allowance shall be paid out of the arrearages of the taxes due for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-four, and the supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-five.
