- III. And he it enacted, That every ship or vessel above forty feet keel, CHAF. one fixth part whereof belongs to any citizen of this state, shall be re-vested above giftered in manner and form herein after directed. be regittered.
- IV. And be it enacted, That if any owner of any vessel of or under Resulte s may forty feet keel shall desire to have a register for such vessel, the same may smaller vessels. be granted in like manner and form.
- V. And be it enacted, That any naval officer of this state may and Form of a reshall, upon application of any owner of any ship or vessel, one fixth part gitter, &c. whereof is the property of a citizen of this state, grant a register for such ship or vessel in the following form, viz. "State of Maryland, to wit: I - naval officer of the district, hereby certify all whom it may concern, that in pursuance of an act of the general assembly of this state, A. B. made oath (or affirmation) before me, that the ship or vessel called — whereof — is at present master, being a sterned vessel, of —— feet keel, and of the burthen of —— tons, was built at — in the year — and that the faid — and — are at present actually and bona fide owners thereof, and that no subject of any state at war or enmity with this state, or the United States, or any of them, hath, directly or indirectly, any part, share, or interest therein, to the best of his knowledge and belief. Given under my hand and feal, this —— day of —— in the —— year of the independence of this state, and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ——" Which said register shall be signed and sealed by the governor of this state, and countersigned by the clerk of the council for the time being.

VI. And be it enacted, That the several naval officers shall make due Naval officers to make enentries of every register granted by them, and transmit true lists thereof tries, &c. to the governor and council for the time being, in the months of June and December annually.

VII. And be it enacted, That upon every register granted as aforesaid, One shilling per ton to be a duty of one shilling current money per ton shall be paid by the master paid, &c. or owner thereof to the naval officer granting the same, and by the said naval officer paid into the public treasury.

VIII. and be it enacted, That the tonnage of all ships and other ves- How tonnage sels shall be ascertained in the following manner, viz. For a double deck tained, &c. vessel, take the length of the keel of every such vessel, (streight rabbit) and the breadth, to be taken within board by the midship beam from plank to plank, and half that breadth shall be accounted the depth of every such vessel, then multiply the length by the breadth, and the product thereof by the depth, and divide the whole by ninety-five, and the quotient shall give the true contents of the tonnage for which such vessel shall pay duty; and for a fingle deck veffel, take the length of keel as aforefaid, the breadth of beam, and depth of hold, and multiply and divide as aforesaid.

IX. And be it enacted, That all registers heretofore granted in this Former restate, shall be delivered up to some one of the naval officers of this state cancelled, &c. and cancelled, and renewed agreeably to this act, without subjecting any ship or vessel to pay any duty for tonnage, or any other charges, except one half the customary fees to the naval officer, for renewing, recording, and transmitting the same.

X. And be it enacted, That if any ship or vessel, one sixth part where- without reof is the property of any citizen of this state, shall lade or take on board gitter forfest. any goods, wares or merchandise, or any article the produce of this or ed, &c.
