land when purchased or vested in the justices aforetaid, by valuation and payment, or tender of the value as aforelaid, thall be bounded with flores or posts at each corner thereof, and the plot of the same, with certificate and explanation, thall be recorded among the records of faid county, and the faid land shall be held by the laid justices and their successors, for ever, as public land for the purposes aforefuld, and other public purposes for the use of the said county, and shall for ever hereaster be called Perrysburgh.

Money unexpant dappais

V. And be it engaged, That if, after the faid court-house and prison shall have been built and crected as aforetaid, on the lot of ground aforetaid, any of the money by this act directed to be recovered, levied and collected as aforefaid thall remain in the hands of the faid committioners, unexpended in the erection of the faid buildings, the fame thall be applied towards defraying the expences of the laid county.

Part of an act repealed, &c.

VI. And be it enacted. That is much of the faid act for the divition of Dorchester and Queen-Anne's counties, and for erecting a new one by the name of Caroline, as directs the building a court-house and gaol at a place called Pig-point, or Edenton, and appropriates ground for the crection of the said buildings, at the place called Pig-point, or Edenton, be, and hereby is repealed.

An ACT to erect a town in Talbot county.

Preamble.

THEREAS fundry inhabitants of Talbot county have, by their humble petition to this general assembly, let with that the village at the court-houte of the laid county hath confiderably increased in number of houses and inhabitants, that chief of the trade of the county is carried on there, and have prayed that the faid village may be crecked into a town, according to the meter and bounds of the land adjoining thereto, as laid down on a plot annexed nothe faid perition: And whereas the prover of the faid petitioners appears to this general affembly to be reasonable;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Mestions ers appointed, Jeremiah Banning, Hugh Sherwood, of Huntington, John Stevens, Greenbury Goldborough, and Alexander McCallum, shall be, and are hereby appointed commissioners, and they, or the major part of them, are hereby authorited and required, as well to buy and purchase all the land contained within the following lines, or fuch part thereof as they, or the mijority of them, thall judge necessary, and the said proprietors thall be willing to sell to them, viz. Beginning at a stone fixed in the ground at the end of a line drawn north fifteen perches and three quarters of a perch from the third boundary of the lot of major Joseph Bruff, deceased, whereon he lately lived, and from thence running east thirty-nine perches, thence north thirty-seven degrees thirty minutes east fixty-five perches, thence south seventy-eight degrees forty-five minutes east forty-fix and a half perches, thence fouth one degree fifteen minutes east one hundred and seventy-three perches, thence south forty-three degrees forty-five minutes west fifty-fix perches, thence west thirty-two perches, thence north seven degrees forty-five minutes west fixty-fix perches, thence west thirty perches, thence north three degrees thirty minutes west seventy perches, thence west eighteen and one quarter perches, thence with a streight line to the beginning, and the same to lay out (excepting such part thereof as is already laid out in lots in the faid village, and the public ground therein, according to their meres, bounds and limits, as now held and post-fied by the inhabitants thereof or others) in the best and most convenient manner into lots, not exceeding one half acre each.
