besther, brother's daughter's hufband, fifter's daughter's hufband, hufband's bowers's fon, hutband's fifter's fon; thall be and hereby is repealed and made void, and all marriages heretofore made and celebrated by and betake a perions related within any of the faid degrees of affinity mentioned in this art, are hereby confirmed and made valid in law, to all intents and purposes, from the time of the celebration of fuch marriages respectively; and and penalties and forfeitures which may have been incurred under the faid act, by any marriage within any of the faid degrees of affinity, are hereby releafed and discharged, and the parties from the same for ever acquitted; and no penalties shall hereaster be incurred under the said act in consequence of any marriage within any of the said degrees of affinity herein before mentioned, but such marriage shall be good, sufficient and valid in law.

A P. XXXVI. \mathbf{H}

An ACT to enable any of the United States to prosecute Passed Mar. 2. actions in any court of law or equity against any person refiding within this state.

Eit enaced, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That any of U. States conthe United States shall be considered and recognised in this state a body politic, body politic and corporate, for the purpose of commencing and prosecuting any action in any court of law or equity in this state, by the name corporate and politic, which such state assumed on the establishment of its government, against any person residing within this state, upon whom such state shall or may have any claim or demand; in which suit the same proceedings shall be had, and there shall be the same right of appeal as in other cases; provided that some citizen of this state shall become answerable by rule of the court in which such suit shall be brought, for payment of costs on behalf of such state, in case judgment or decree be rendered or given against such state.

An ACT to enable John Eager Howard and George Lux, of Passed Mar. 25 Baltimore county, to grant and convey to the commissioners of Baltimore-town, and their successors, a parcel of ground adjoining the said town, for the purposes therein mentioned.

HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the Preamble. petition of fundry inhabitants of Baltimore-town, that John Eager Howard and George Lux have voluntarily offered to give and grant to the commissioners of Baltimore-town and their succesfors, in fee simple, a parcel of ground contiguous to the said town, for the purpose of a burying ground for strangers and others who shall hereaster depart this life in the said town, provided the leave of the legislature should be obtained for that purpose; and this general assembly being defirous of promoting the laudable and pious purposes of the said petition, have granted leave accordingly: Therefore,

11. To it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioncommissioners of Baltimore-town, as a body politic, shall have full power ceive a grant, and authority, to take and receive a grant from John Eager Howard and &c. George Lux, for the faid parcel of ground, to them and their successors for ever hereatter, in trutt for the intent and purpose that the said parcel of ground shall, under such regulations and restrictions as the commissieners of the faid town shall from time to time adopt, be used and occupied as applied of common interment for ftrangers, poor people and negroes, who shall die in the faid town, and for no other purpose, III.
