11. Be it enatted, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the velley CHAP. of Saint Paul's parith, in Baltimore county, are hereby permitted to take villy may and receive a grant from the faid John Eager Howard, to them, and their receive a successors for ever hereafter, for all that piece or parcel of ground contained within the following metes and bounds, courles and distances, it being part of a tract of land called Lun's Lot; beginning for the same, on the north side of north-west street, in Baltimore-town, and where the said street intersects the north-north-east two hundred and seventy-five perches line of faid land called Lun's Lot, and running north-west binding on north-west street one hundred and sixty-sive feet, thence north-north-east parallel with the said north-north-east line one hundred and forty seet, then east-south-east one hundred and sifty-sive feet until it intersects the north-north-east line aforesaid, then binding on said line, reversing the same to the place of beginning, containing one half acre and twenty-eight square perches of land, more or less, for the intent and purpose of erecling a parsonage thereon, for the residence of the minister of the said parish for the time being, and that the faid grant, when executed, acknowledged and recorded, with the solemnities required by law for the conveyance of real Thates, shall be good and effectual in the courts of law and equity in this Rate, and the vestry of the said parish, and their successors, shall be vested with an estate in see simple therein; saving, nevertheless, to the state of Maryland, and all bodies politic and corporate, and all persons not mennioned in this act, their several and respective rights.

C H A P. XLI.

An ACT for the valuation of personal property within this Passed Mar. 8. Itate.

TE it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all personal Personal proproperty in this state, not belonging to this state, or the United valued, &c. States, or to any church, county or parish, or to either of the colleges, or to any county school, or to any corporation for charitable wies, (except the crop and produce of the land for the year next preceding the time of valuation in the hands of the person whose land produced the same, provisions (not including live stock) necessary for the use and confumption of the person to whom the same shall belong, and his samily, for the year, and plantation utenfils, the working tools of mechanics and manufacturers, actually and constantly employed in their respective occupations, ready money, wearing apparel, and goods, wares and merchandise, imported,) shall be valued agreeably to the directions of this ach, and shall be chargeable, according to such valuation, with the public assessinent.

II. And be it enaced, That five sensible, discreet, and experienced commission persons, shall be appointed in each country of this state, who shall be cal- pointed, so led commissioners of the tax, and they, or any three or more of them, shall be the commissioners for each county, until the first day of February, in the year seventeen hundred and ninety-one; and sive persons, as aforesaid, shall be appointed, and called commissioners of the tax for Balclimore-rown, Wor the fame time; provided, I hat no member of the gemeral assembly of the council, clergyman, practifing attorney or physician, Merlif, clerk of the general or any county court, ordinary-keeper, mariner, or inspector, shall be appointed a commissioner or assessor.
