buildings and improvements, in faid town, who shall have authority to inquire as aforefaid. And the commissioners of the several counties, and of Baltimore-town, respectively, shall examine all former returns of property in the towns, and upon the best information they can get, and view of the premises, if necessary, shall value the ground-rent and real property in the towns aforefaid, according to the rules herein after prefcribed.

VII. and be it enacted, That the commissioners, in estimating estates How tee time and interests in lands, shall observe the following rules, to wit, that all to be valued, lands held or enjoyed immediately by tenants in fee-fimple absolute, or wefee-fimple conditional or executory, or fee-tail, shall be wholly valued to fuch tenants; and where divers persons have particular estates or interests carved out of the same inheritance, as in dower, or by the courtesy, or for life or years, with reversions or remainders for life, in tail or feefimple, a just computation thereof shall be made in proportion to the value, of their particular interests therein, so that added together they shall amount to the full value of fuch lands, estimated agreeably to the directions of this act, and no more; and the faid commissioners shall, in making their computation aforesaid, consider the tenantcy in dower, by the courtesy, or for life in possession, or estate for fifteen years without any valuable rent referved, generally worth half the value of the fee-simple, but they may vary from this general rule as justice may require, confidering the age and health of the tenant in dower, by the courtefy, or for life, and the chance of the remainder or reversion, or the length of the term for years, and value of the rent reserved, as the case may be; and if the menant, or person holding a particular estate or interest, shall pay the publie the fum valued for the estate or interest of any landlord, reversioner, son remainderman; the person so paying may retain the land in his posses--fion until he is repaid, or may have his action against the lessor, reversioner, or remainderman, or his heir, executor or administrator, for the fum he shall pay, as for money paid for his use, or may deduct the money so paid, or any part thereof, out of any rent reserved upon his tenantcy; but where a valuable and full rent is reserved, so that the interest of the tenant cannot be confidered as valuable, the landlord, or perfon entitled in fee-fimple or fee-tail to the land or property from which the rent iffues, shall pay on the whole value of the lands, and the tenant in fuch case paying the public, may retain, deduct, or have his action, as :aforefaid:

VIII. And he it enacted, That as a rule for the commissioners of the How ground--tax) to afcertain the value of ground-rent in Annapolis, Frederick, Balti- is to be aver-- more and its precincts, and other towns, the persons entitled to ground- tained, &c. rent to the amount of eight pounds, shall be affested as for one hundred spounds capital, and in the same proportion for any greater or less sum of ground-rent; and the lessees or persons holding the ground, shall be as--fessed from the actual worth of the improvements made fince the lease for conveyance; and the present value of the land, after deducting therefrom -the walue thereof at the time of the leafe or conveyance, which value hall be estimated at one hundred pounds for every eight pounds of the groundrent referved, and to pro rato for every greater or less sum of ground-rent; and the lesses, or persons holding the ground, shall be chargeable with -and pay the sum rated to the lessors, and may deduct the same out of the prent, unless otherwise agreed between the person holding the ground and withe person claiming the rent; but if the lessee, or person holding the ground when the same was affested, cannot be found, so that the sum ga-. Ted to the person entitled to the ground-rent cannot be collected from the -person holding the ground, then the person entitled to the rent shall be liable · to pay the affeliment on the same. And as a rule for the commissioners to afoertain the value of houses in Annapolis, Frederick, Baltimore and its precincts,
