eth day of December next, obtain a copy of his bond, and file the fame in the general court, and thereupon scire facias shall issue against such collector and his securities, in the same manner as on bonds to the loan-office. and fimilar proceedings shall be had to compel payment of the money due, with interest of ten per cent. from the said tenth day of December next.

CHAP.

XII. And, to prevent any damage to any collector from the negligence of his deputies, or by their receiving the taxes and converting the tame to their own use, Be it enacted, That the commissioners of the tax be em- commissionpowered on hearing (or default to appear on notice) to adjust the account accounts, &c. between the collector and any of his deputies, concerning his receipt, collection, or neglect of duty, as deputy collector, and may order the balance to be paid, either immediately, or by a short day to be limited, and may also carry such order into effect by their warrant directed to the sheriff, to levy the sum due in the same manner as by fier! faciat, on the lands, goods or chattels, of the deputy, or to take his body in execution, as on a capias ad fatisfaciendum, in fatisfaction thereof.

XIII. and be it enauted, That all the certificates of tax or affestiment Certificates, aforefaid, made out by the commissioners, and all their books of proceeds transcribed, ings, and the accounts by them lettled with the feveral collectors, shall acbe fairly transcribed by their clerk, and figned by them, and delivered to the sheriff of their respective counties on or before the twenty-fifth day of November next, under the penalty of fifty pounds current money, to be by the faid theriff forwarded as public letters to the clerk of the house of delegates; and the certificates aforefaid, and the proceedings of the commissioners, and accounts by them lettled with the leveral collectors, shall be by them delivered, on or before the twenty-fifth day of November next, to the clerk of their county, under the penalty of fifty pounds current money, to be by the faid clerk safely kept in his office for the inspection of the inhabitants of such county.

XIV. and be it endded, That the commissioners of the tax in the se- commissionveral counties shall procure a good well bound book, and shall annually a book, &c. cause the final account settled with the collectors of the tax, and also the fummary account, to be entered therein, and such final account shall be good and fufficient evidence of such account; and the commissioners of the tax shall also transmit a copy of the said final account to the clerk of the general court of their shore, who shall record the same among the records of his court.

XV. And be it enacted, That the collector of each county, and of Collectors to Baltimore-town, at the time of the settlement of his account, shall pay fioners, &c. to every commissioner ten shillings for each day he shall necessarily attend, and shall also pay to the faid commissioners, for the use of their clerk, a fum not exceeding ten shillings per day, for his services under this act; and the amount of all the fums so paid shall, by the said commissioners, be allowed to the faid collector on the lettlement of his account, in which account shall be expressed the name of the clerk, and the sum of money to him allowed; and the faid commissioners shall, after the receipt of the faid fum for the use of the clerk, pay the same to him or his order, on demand, under the penalty of fifty pounds current money to the party grieved; and the faid collectors shall pay the commissioners for the use of the affestors, (for the full and faithful performance of their duty under this acr) any fum not exceeding twenty-five pounds current money for each assessor, which the commissioners shall judge an adequate reward for his service; and the money paid by the commissioners shall be allowed the collector on the fettlement of his account, in which shall be expressed Mm
