An ACT respecting the loan made by this state with Mes- Passed March sieurs Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphorst, of Amsterdam, merchants.

ZHEREAS a loan was negotiated by Matthew Ridley, Preamble. Esquire, agent of this state, with Messieurs Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphorst, and a dissertable of opinion hath arisen concern? ing the said loan and contract, and the terms and conditions thereof, and this general assembly are of opinion, that on the principles of justice, and a reasonable construction of the contract made on the thirty-first day of July seventeen hundred and eighty-two by the said Mathew Ridley, Esquire, with the said Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphors, this state is only bound to pay them tobacco, at the place and price stipulated, sufficient to discharge the annual interest on the loan,

II. 28t it encired, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That out of any Money applipublic money that may come into the treasury before the first day of ment of in-November seventeen hundred and eighty-six, and not heretosore appro-terest, &c. priated and applied to congress, the civil list; and the payment of interest to the creditors of this state, so much thereof as may be necessary, be applied to the payment of three years interest on the said loan, on br. before the faid first day of November next.

III. And be it enacted, That it is hereby proposed by this general Proposal to assembly to Messieurs Nicholas and Jacob Vanstaphorst, to receive seven en, &c. and a half per cent. interest on the loan from the time of the loan to the expiration of the third year, and fix per cent. afterwards, payable annually in the month of November in the city of Amsterdam, in lieu of the payment of the interest in tobacco, for the residue of the term of the loan; and until the principal be discharged.

IV. And be it enabled, That if Messieurs Vanskaphorsk shall decline to If not acceptaccept the above proposition, and signify their distent, that the governor &c. to agree and the council he authorised and requested to agree with their agent on with agent, the appointment of arbitrators (not citizens of this state, and not exceedthe appointment of arbitrators (not citizens of this state, and not exceeding four persons) two of them to be nominated by the governor and the council on behalf of the state, and two on behalf of the Messicurs Vanstaphorsts, with power to the said arbitrators, in case of disserence, to choose a fifth person, who shall have power to determine on the contract aforefaid, and the terms thereof, and to afcertain the damages (if any) to be paid by this state, and the faith of this government is hereby pledged to abide by and perform the award of the faid arbitrators.
