and pay the whole duties by him received, it shall and may be lawful for the faid commissioners, on motion made to Baltimore county court, to demand judgment against such collector for all tolls wherewith he shall be chargeable by this act; and fuch court shall give judgment and award execution thereupon against such collector and his fecurities, provided they have ten days previous notice.

CHAP. XXIII.

XX. And he it enacted, That the money arising from the said tolls last men- How the mode tioned, shall be applied by the said commissioners of review towards defraying new arising the applied by the said roads and the said towards defraying from tolls is the expences of clearing and making the faid roads; and the faid tolls shall cease to be applied, in part, or the whole, at such time and times as the said commissioners shall &c. determine.

XXI. And be it enacted, That the commissioners appointed to survey and Road to Reismake the roads aforesaid, shall first make the road to Reister's-town, and then the be first made; road towards York the distance of eighteen miles, and then the road towards &c. Frederick-town as far as the line of the county, and then alternately the same distance of the road from Reister's-town, and the residue of the road towards York-town.

XXII. and, as a further fund to enable the said commissioners to make the faid roads, Be it enacted, That the sum of two shillings and six-pence current Two shillings money, shall be and hereby is laid and imposed for every hundred pounds worth and six pence to be an experience to be an experience. of property within Baltimore county, and in the same proportion for every greater poied, &c. or less sum, and the said tax shall be paid and collected with the county tax, and in the same manner, and the collector shall pay the amount of the said tax by him collected to such person as the commissioners of review shall appoint to receive the same, who shall, from time to time, pay the same to their order, and the faid tax shall commence in the year seventeen hundred and eighty-eight, and continue until the said roads shall be made and completed in the manner directed by this act; and the said commissioners may, on the credit of the said tax, borrow, on interest, not exceeding fix per cent. any sum of money they may think proper and necessary to make and complete the said roads; and the said commissioners shall, from time to time, at least twice in every year, publish in the Baltimore news-papers an account of the money by them received and expended in virtue of this act.

XXIII. And be it enacted, That if any commissioner appointed to survey and How vacant make the said roads shall die or refuse to act, the said commissioners of review filled. may fill up such vacancy; and if any commissioner of review shall die or resuse to act, the commissioners of the tax for Baltimore county may fill up such vacancy.

XXIV. and be it enacted. That the commissioners appointed to survey and make Commissionthe said roads, shall in all things consult and advise with the said commissioners ers to consult; of review, and all their proceedings shall be subject to their direction and control.

XXV. And he it enacted, That any toll to be collected on any of the roads Tolls shall aforesaid, shall belong to Baltimore county, and shall be collected and applied to Baltimore the use of the said county for ever, the said county maintaining and repairing the county, &c. faid roads in the order and condition directed and required by this act.
