faid, a fun not exceeding feventy-five pounds current money per annum, as a falary, and so pro rate, during his continuance in office, and thall then take bond, which the faid overfeer, and any other overfeer to be appointed, shall and is hereby obliged to enter into, with good and sufficient sureties, in the penalty of two hundred pounds current money, payable to the faid truftees for the poor, conditioned as follows, to wit, "The condition of the above obligation is such, that, if the above bound A. B. as overfeer of the alms and work-house in Caroline county, thall well and truly discharge his duty in the said station, and more particularly according to the directions of the act of assembly, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor in Caroline county, then the obligation to be void, otherwife to remain in full force and virtue in law."

CHAP.

XI. And he it enasted, That the said trustees, or a major part of them, shall May remove and they are hereby directed and empowered to remove such overfeer, and all other officers to be by them appointed in pursuance of this act, at their discretion, and to choose others in their place and stead.

XII. And be it enacted. That the said trustees, or the major part of them, And meet shall, and they are hereby directed and enjoined to meet at the alms and work- four times in the fold country four times in house in the said county four times in the year, in the first week in January, May, August and November, or oftener, if it should by them be deemed necessary, to make and ordain, by a majority of votes of such as may be present, all such good and wholesome ordinances, rules and by-laws, as they shall think convenient and necessary for the direction, government and support, of alms and work-house; and also for the maintenance and employment of all such poor persons as shall be taken under their care, and of all vagrants, beggars, vagabonds, and other offenders, that shall be committed thereto by virtue of this act; all which ordinances, rules and by-laws, shall be, from time to time, inviolably observed by all persons concerned, according to the tenor and effect thereof.

XIII. And be it enacted, That the said overseer shall keep a fair and regular Overseer to lift of all poor, and of all beggars, vagrants, vagabonds, and other offenders, who keep a fair lift of all poor, shall be committed to the said alms and work-house; and also fair and regular &c. accounts in writing of all materials, and other things, coming to his hands as overseer aforesaid, and of all expences and charges attending their maintenance and support, and of all monies received by him for the sale of the produce of their labour, and otherwise, as overseer aforesaid, and shall lay the said lists and accounts before the trustees, or the major part of them, at their meetings at the times by this act directed, or oftener, if by them required.

XIV. And he it enacted, That the laid overfeer may compel and oblige any And may of the said poor, beggars, vagrants and vagabonds, or other offenders, in his competer offenders, in his to work, &c. alms and work-house, if of sufficient ability, to work and labour, and the produce of their labour he is hereby directed and empowered to sell, and apply the money arising from such sale to their maintenance and support.

XV. And be it enacted, That upon complaint made, that any person, from Diferderly his or her disorderly conduct, gives disturbance to his or her neighbourhood, and b. commitis likely to become chargeable to the said county, it shall and may be lawful for ted, &c. any one magistrate of the said county, if upon hearing the party he shall judge the complaint to be well founded, to commit such disorderly person, residing within the faid county, to the faid work-house, for any time not exceeding three months, unless he or she shall find security, at the discretion of the magistrate aforefaid, in any fum not exceeding ten pounds current money, for his or her good behaviour during the space of six months; and also upon complaint and due proof made by the overleer of the faid alms and work-house to any one truftee, that any person in the said work-house hath behaved and demeaned him or herfelf in a disorderly manner, or hath resused to do and perform his or her daily labour and task, or hath refused or neglected to obey, keep and observe, any of the ordinances, rules and by-laws, of the faid corporation, to order and
