C H A P. LXIII.

An ACT respecting the sees of the attorney-general and his de-Passed Deputies on executions in certain cases.

HEREAS it is unreasonable that the attorney-general and his depu-Preamble. ties should receive fees for executions issued in criminal cases, when no fees are allowed to attornies for executions issued in civil cases;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That no fees shall be No fees to be charged or received, after the passing of this act, by the attorney-general, or any charged, &c. of his deputies, for any execution to be issued against any person, or his securities, general, &c. for any fine imposed, or to be imposed, by any court of this state, or the costs on the prosecution.

III. And he it enamed, That all such parts of an act, entitled, An act for the Parts of an act more speedy and effectual recovery of common law sines and forfeited recog-repealed. nizances, as give sees to the attorney-general, or his deputies, in the cases afore-said, shall be and are hereby repealed.

An ACT to alter the time of holding the courts in the counties Passed December 26.

HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that the holding Preamble. of some of the county courts in this state at the times prescribed by law, is attended with considerable inconvenience,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after When courts the first day of January next, the courts for Allegany county shall hereaster be are to be held. respectively held on the fourth Monday in April and on the third Monday of October, in each year, and the courts of Charles county shall hereaster be held on the third Mondays in March and August in each year, and of Calvert county on the third Mondays in April and September in each year.

III. And he it enacted, That all process, pleas and proceedings, civil and Process, &c. criminal, issued or to be issued, and depending on the said first day of January continued, next in any of the said county courts, shall be continued, and shall be returned and returnable to the days and times herein above specified for the respective counties, any thing in any former law to the contrary notwithstanding.

C H A P. LXV.

An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate Passed Depublic ferries.

HEREAS doubts have arisen whether the several county courts of Preamble. this state have power to contract for the keeping of such ferries as they may think necessary, at the county expence;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the several Courts to concounty courts shall be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to contract for public ferries, as they shall judge reasonable, for the keeping of public ferries at such place or places as they shall judge necessary, and that the price so contracted for shall be paid by and levied on the county in the same manner as other county charges; and in such cases the said courts shall respectively take recognizances from, and ascertain the prices to be taken by, the persons keeping such ferries, from all persons not entitled to pass free, in the manner directed by the original act to which this is an additional supplement.
