thall be recovered by warrant issued by any justice of the peace for the respective CHAP. counties, in which said trustees, as a corporation, shall be plaintiffs, and when recovered shall be applied as by the said recited act is directed.

## C H A P. XXV.

An ACT to lay out a road from Francis Snowden's mill, in Passed De-Baltimore county, to the Great falls of Patapsco, at or near Solomon Allen's mill, where the great road crosses said falls, and to lay out a road from the faid Snowden's mill to interfect the old road leading from Baltimore to Liberty-

THEREAS it appears by the petition of Francis Snowden to this ge-Preamble. neral affembly, that the public are incommoded for want of a road from Francis Snowden's mill, in Baltimore county, to the Great falls of Patapico, at or near Solomon Allen's mill, where the great road croffes faid falls, and a road from the faid Snowden's mill to interfect the old road leading from Baltimore to Liberty-town; and this general assembly thinking the prayer of said petition reasonable,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Edward Cockey, Commission-Thomas Beasman and Beas Owings, or any two of them, be and they are hereby ersappointed, appointed commissioners to survey, lay out and open, at the expence of the said Francis Snowden, a road not exceeding thirty-three feet wide, in such direction as the situation of the ground will admit, and best answer the purposes of this act, from Francis Snowden's mill, in Baltimore county, to the Great falls of Patapsco, at or near Solomon Allen's mill, where the great road crosses said falls, and to lay out a road from the faid Snowden's mill to interfect the old road leading from Baltimore. to Liberty-town; and the said roads, when so surveyed, laid out and opened, and the valuation herein after directed to be made shall have taken place, shall be recorded in Baltimore county court, and shall be deemed and taken to be public roads for ever thereafter, and kept up, amended and repaired, as all other public roads in the faid county.

III. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall ascertain and value Who shall aswhat damages may be sustained by any person or persons through whose land the mages, &c. faid roads shall pais, and the same, when so affested, shall be paid, or secured to be paid, by the faid petitioner, before the faid commissioners shall proceed to open the faid roads: Provided always, that if any person or persons, through whose land the said roads shall pass, or his, her or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by such valuation and assessment of damages by the faid commissioners, it shall and may be lawful for the said commissioners, or any two of them, to issue their warrant to any constable of the county, to summon five freeholders of the county, not interested in the premises, and qualified to serve as jurors in the county court, to appear on a day by them to be appointed, on the premises; and the said commissioners are hereby authorised to administer an oath to every person so summoned, that he will, without favour, affection, prejudice or partiality, affess the damages sustained by the person at whose request such inquisition shall be taken, by reason of opening the aforesaid roads through his, her, or their lands; and the persons so summoned and sworn shall thereupon proceed to assess and value the damages accordingly, of which the said petitioner shall have had at least five days previous notice; and such inquisition shall be final and conclusive between the parties.

IV. And he it enacted, That the faid commissioners shall not lay out or open Road not to the faid roads through the buildings, gardens or orchards, of any person, without ings, &c. his or her consent.
