III. and he it enacted. That such additional allowance to be made to the faid William Benson as aforesaid, shall be paid by the said commissioners out of any fum or sums of money they may have received in virtue of the act of assembly aforesaid, over and above the sum of thirteen hundred pounds already agreed to be paid to the said William Benson; and if a sufficient sum of money shall not remain in their hands, for the purpose aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for the said commissioners to certify to the justices of the levy court of Caroline county, at their next fitting, what further sum of money will be necessary.

Justices to asfeis money, &c.

IV. And be it enacted. That the justices of Caroline county, upon their receiving such certificate from the said commissioners as aforesaid, shall, and they are hereby authorised and directed, immediately to assess and levy (as a part of the county levy, and to be collected by the sheriff of Caroline county in the same manner and under the same penalties and obligations,) upon the assessa ble property of their county, the sum of money thus certified by the said commissioners, together with a commission of four per cent. for the collection thereof.

To be collected by the sheriff, &c.

V. And be it enacted, That the said sheriff shall, on or before the first day of December next ensuing the affessment thereof by the justices of Caroline county, collect the sum of money aforesaid, and pay the same to the commissioners aforesaid, or such person as they shall authorise to receive the same, to be by them applied forthwith in the manner prescribed by this act; provided however, that the faid William Benson shall complete and finish the said court-house, in the manner stipulated by his own agreement, in such time as the commissioners shall think reasonable and shall allow him, and that the said William Benson shall not be entitled to receive the faid sum of money until the faid building shall be finished, but the faid commissioners may make such advances of money to him as they shall, in their discretion, think proper.

VI. and, whereas it appears from several acts of assembly heretofore made, that confiderable sums of money and quantities of tobacco, have from time to time been levied on the inhabitants of Caroline county for the purpose of building a court-house and gaol in the said county, and the commissioners aforesaid were authorised by the act of assembly above mentioned, to demand, sue for, recover and receive the same, of the persons chargeable by law with the payment Assatement to thereof, or in whose hands the same might be, Be it surther enasted, That the said commissioners shall make out and lay before the general assembly, at their next session, a statement of the monies received and expended by them by virtue of the act of affembly above mentioned, and what balances shall be then remaining in the hands of the several persons chargeable with the payment thereof.

An ACT to establish a bank in the district of Columbia.

Preamble.

HEREAS the agricultural and commercial interests of this state may be promoted, and the preparations for the permanent residence of congress facilitated, by the establishment of a bank within the territory of Columbia, and within the present jurisdiction of this state;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a subscription therefor, to consist of ten thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, be opened, under the care of Samuel Blodget, junior, William Deakins, junior, Uriah Forrest, John Mason, James Maccubbin Lingan, Francis Lowndes, Marsham Warring, Peter Cassanave, William Burrell Magruder, Joseph Forrest, Thomas Peter, John Templeman and Benjamin Stoddert.

III. And be it enacted. That the sums so subscribed shall be paid in the solmer the sums lowing manner, viz. Every subscriber, at the time of subscribing, shall pay to be paid, &c. two dollars for each share by him subscribed, to the person or persons appointed by this act to take in subscriptions, and the remaining ninety-eight dollars for each share shall be paid to the president and directors of the bank, elected agreeable
