CHAP.

XIV. And be it enacted, That if any person whatsoever, after the erection and On persons receipt of the said market-house as aforesaid, shall presume to sell, or cause to be selling out of market, &c. fold, to any free inhabitant of the faid town, or any servant or slave of such inhabitant, any article of provisions whatsoever, which such person may be bringing or sending, or have brought or sent, to the said town, or within two miles thereof, for sale, (except the articles herein before excepted,) either upon the stated market-days aforesaid, or on any other days during the time of the markethours herein before established, at any other place whatsoever but at or in the said market-house, every such person shall forfeit and pay the sum of fifteen shillings current money for every offence.

And be it enacted, That if any person shall presume to slaughter or Forslaughterbutcher any kind of cattle, sheep or hogs, in or near the said market-house, or ing near the suffer the same to be done, every person so offending shall forfeit and pay the sum &c. of fifteen shillings current money for every offence.

And he it enacted, That if any person, after the time herein before li- And putting mitted, shall put, or cause to be put, any horse, mare or gelding, into or under &c. the said market-house, on any pretence whatsoever, every such person shall forfeit and pay the sum of five shillings current money for every such offence.

XVII. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of the said town, to be ap- A clerk to be pointed by virtue of this act, shall, after the erection and receipt of the said mar-appointed annually, &c. ket-house as aforesaid, nominate and appoint a person of good repute and skill, to be the clerk of the said market, and if the person so appointed shall die, reign, or refuse to act, or be rendered incapable of acting by reason of misbehaviour, or removal from office, the said commissioners shall assemble together, as foon thereafter as conveniently may be, and nominate and appoint another qualihed person, to be the clerk of the said market for the remainder of the year.

XVIII. And be it enacted, That every person to be appointed clerk of the said Who shall market as aforesaid, before he shall proceed to act as such, shall take an oath, or take an oath, ffirmation, before the said commissioners, that he will diligently and saithfully, ecording to the best of his skill and judgment, execute and perform the several Juties of clerk of the said market without favour, affection or partiality, and that e will not, directly or indirectly, demand or receive any fee or reward for performing such duties, but what is or shall be allowed by law; and the said oath, raffirmation, shall be administered by the said commissioners, or any one of hem, and the taking thereof be entered among their proceedings.

XIX. and he it enacted, That the clerk of the said market shall have suffi- His powers. ent power and authority, at all times thereafter, to take care and charge of the id market-house, and of the market thereof, and to examine and inspect the iduals and provisions brought thereto for sale; to examine and try the weight of butter brought to the said market, previously made up in prints or parcels, nd if the same shall not be found of the weight pretended by the person offering he same for sale, to seize and appropriate the same to the use of any prisoners ho may then be in the county gaol, or if there be no such prisoners, to the use the poor-house, and if any shall be found unsound or unwholesome, to seize nd destroy the same; and also to try and adjust the scales, weights and measures, fed at the said market, by the standards of the county, and if any weights or casures shall be salse or untrue, to seize the same, and on a just alteration thereto dispose of the same at public sale to the highest bidder, and to account for the oney arising from those sales with the said commissioners; and if any person all think himself aggrieved by any seizure made by the clerk of said market, he
