XLIII.

A Further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to prohibit Passed December 25. bringing slaves into this state.

THEREAS doubts may arise, whether persons who come from ano-Preamble. ther state to reside in this state may bring their slaves into this state, before such persons have actually resided one year in this state;

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after Persons may the passing this act it shall and may be lawful for any citizen of the United import their slaves, &c. States, who shall come into this state with a bond fide intention of settling therein, to import or bring into this state, at the time of his or her removal into this state, or within one year thereafter, any flave or flaves, the property of such citizen at the time of his or her faid removal, which slave or slaves shall have been resident of the United States, or any one of them, three whole years next preceding such removal, and the same to retain as slaves.

III. Provided nevertheless, and be it enacted, That nothing in this act shall Provise. be construed to enable any person, so removing as aforesaid, to sell or dispose of any flave or flaves imported by virtue of this act, or their increase, to any citizen of this state, unless such person shall have resided within this state three whole years next preceding such sale, except in cases of disposition by last will and testament, and disposition by law, consequent upon intestacy; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be taken or construed in any manner to affect any claim which any negro or negroes fo imported may have to freedom, from any other cause than being brought into this state agreeably to the provisions of this act.

H A P. XLIV.

An ACT to enable the vestry of Saint-Paul's parish, in Baltimore Passed December 25. county, to purchase one or more parcels of ground for the purposes therein mentioned.

HEREAS the vestry of Saint-Paul's parish, in Baltimore county, by Preamble. their petition to this general affembly, have set forth, that the congregation of the protestant episcopal church in the said county is at this time so numerous, that the present church in Baltimore-town is not sufficient to accommodate the different families belonging to the same with pews, by reason whereof a very large number of the members of the said church, both in the hid town and county, cannot conveniently resort to the same, and that they are desirous to build one or more churches for the performance of divine worship in the said county, in such convenient place or places as will best suit the said congregation, and to have a burial ground to each of them, and also a lot of ground djoining one of them for a parsonage-house, and for that purpose to purchase one or more pieces of ground, not exceeding three acres in the whole, for the uses and purposes aforesaid, and to take one or more deed or deeds to the said vestry, and their successors, for ever; therefore,
