cence to renew from time to time as is now practifed, and so allow to the pern to whom the faid licence shall be granted such compensation for keeping said mry as they in their judgment shall think adequate for the keeping the same.

CHAP. XXIXX

III. And be it enacted. That the said ferry, when licensed by the county Ferry deemed court aforesaid, shall be for ever thereafter deemed and taken to be a public ferry, public. and subject to the same regulations as public servies now are by the existing laws of this state.

IV. And be it enacted, That Levin Winder, Robert Jones, senior, William Commission-Jones, (Menokin,) Lambert Hyland and George Irving, or the major part of ersappointed, them, shall be commissioners, and are hereby authorised to purchase, if they hould think necessary, two pieces of ground for the use of the county aforesaid, one of which to be on each fide of the ferry aforesaid, not exceeding one acre in the whole, for the purpose of landing places, and on which to erect wharfs, if necessary; and the said commissioners are hereby empowered to contract for materials, and to agree with some person or persons to build and finish the said wharfs, which, when completed, shall be and remain as public wharfs for the le of Somerset county.

V. And be it enasted, That the justices of the peace of Somerset county, at Justices to leheir next levy court, be and they are hereby authorised and directed to impose on wy money, the affessable property of said county a sum not exceeding one hundred and twenw dollars, together with an allowance of fix per cent. to the collector for colktion, which sum, so assessed, shall be collected by the collector of Somerset munty aforesaid as other county charges are collected, and when so collected hill, by the said collector, be paid to the commissioners asoresaid, or the major mit of them, to be by them applied in payment for the ground, and the building he wharfs aforesaid.

VI. And be it enacted, That in case any of the said commissioners shall die, How vacanmove, or be incapable to act, the residue, or the major part of them, shall fill filled. on the vacancy or vacancies.

VII. And he it enaced, That in case the said commissioners and the owner or Value to be owners of the pieces of ground aforesaid cannot agree on the prices thereof, or &c. the owners, or either of them, shall be under any disability to contract for the the thereof, any two justices of the peace for Somerset county are hereby auhorifed to direct the sheriff of Somerfet county to summon twelve good and lawmen of his bailiwick, not interested in the said lands nor related to the parties, appear upon each of the said pieces of ground, who shall be impannelled and worn as a jury to inquire into the value of the faid pieces of ground, or either them; and the said commissioners shall pay to the owner or owners of said ands the sum or sums assessed by the said jury to be the value of the lands aforeand thereupon the property in the said pieces of ground shall be vested in he said county for ever for the purposes aforesaid.

C H A P. XXV.

Supplement to the act for building a new gaol in the town of Passed Januatafton, in Talbot county, and to provide for the regulation of e said gaol.

HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that since the Preamble. pallage of the act, entitled, An act for building a new gaol in the town of Easton, in Talbot county, and to provide for the regulation said gaol, enacted at November session, in the year one thousand seven and ninety-four, Samuel Sharp and Samuel Logan, two of the comers appointed by the said act for superintending the building of the said re deceased, and there is no provision in the said act for supplying the ies occasioned by their death; therefore,
