committioners, and their successors, for the use and in trutt for the benefit CHAP. advantage of the inhamiants of the faid town; and the clerk of the faid market shall have full power, under the direction of the said committioners, to and hire out the stalls and shambles of the said market-house upon the best rims, and to keep a fair and just account, as well of the persons renting as of profits arising from such rents, and to render duplicates of such accounts to faid commissioners annually, on the first Monday of March, or oftener if he be required; and the faid rents and profits shall be paid to the order of the und commissioners, and be applied to the uses directed by this act, and in default payment, the same shall be recovered, in the name of the said commissioners, from any tenant or person refusing or delaying to pay the same, by the warrant of a justice of the peace, as in the case of small debts before a magistrate; and the clerk of the said market shall be allowed a reasonable compensation for his pervices, not exceeding the sum of twenty dollars per annum, to be ascertained by the said commissioners, and to be raised by voluntary contribution from the inhabitants of faid town.

XIII. And be it enacted, That the commissioners of the said town shall, on A meeting to the first Monday of March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and be called, &c. annually on the first Monday in March thereafter, by public notice of at least un days, call a meeting of the inhabitants of said town who are entitled to vote, to choose commissioners for the ensuing year, at which election any justice of the peace may preside; and the said inhabitants shall then choose, viva voce, five dicreet reputable persons, inhabitants of said town, or of Sand-town, in Queen-Anne's county, to act as commissioners for one year from and after the first day of April next ensuing; and it shall be lawful for all male white persons, residents of faid town, and having a family therein, to vote at faid elections for commissoners, and the five persons having the greatest number of votes at said election hall be commissioners for one year, to execute the duties of this act; and the commissioners shall, by election among themselves, fill all vacancies which may happen in their own body within the year.

XIV. And be it enacted. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons Swine not to 10 suffer swine to go at large within the circle of one half mile from Gilpin's go at large, brick mill; and if any swine shall be found going at large within the limits soresaid, it shall be lawful for any person to seize and impound the same, giving otice thereof at the market-house aforefaid for five days successively, and if no person shall claim such swine within the five days aforesaid, and if claimed, and owner will not pay within the said five days the sum of three shillings and me-pence per head for each and every day such swine shall be impounded, it all and may be lawful for the person making such seizure to sell such swine, d after deducting the sum of three shillings and nine-pence per head for each d every day the said swine has been impounded, he shall pay the balance, if y, to the commissioners of said town, to be applied as is hereafter directed, if ot demanded by the owner or owners of such swine in three months after the me of fale.

NV. And be it enacted, That the fines, penalties and forfeitures, incurred How fines, er this act, shall be recovered before a justice of the peace, upon the com-recovered, at, on oath or affirmation, of one competent and credible witness, as other &c. debts are recovered, and the said penalties and forseitures shall be paid to commissioner first named in this act, and hereaster to his successor, having greatest number of votes at any election for commissioners which shall heretake place, to be applied, under the direction of a majority of faid commisrs, to the repair and support of the said market-house, or otherwise, as they eir discretion may think proper, for the improvement and regulation of laid town, and for the improvement of Sand-town, in Queen-Anne's
