C H A P. XXXVII.

ACT to allow further time for collecting the balances due Passed Janua. Thomas O'Bryon, late sheriff and collector of Queen-Anne's county, deceased.

THEREAS by an act of assembly, passed at November session, seven- Preamble. teen hundred and ninety-six, Matthew Hawkins, James O'Bryon, David Lindsey, William Clayton, Edward Wright, John King Downes, Henry Pratt, Robert Waters and William Diamond, securities of Thomas O'Bryon, a former sheriff of Queen-Anne's county, were authorised to sollect, on or before the first day of January, seventeen hundred and ninetyeight, all balances due to the said Thomas O Bryon as sheriff and collector of the said county: And whereas it is represented to this general assembly, that wing to the late arrival of the laws, and some differences with the administrator 1 to the right of the faid securities to collect the sees due to the sheriff in his right for services by him persormed, they were unable to collect the aforehaid balances; and the faid administrator, by his petition to this legislature, having fignified his confent that the right of collecting the fees to due to the faid heriff for services by him performed should be given to the securities, with a lower to apply the same in just and fair proportions to the discharge of debts due from him in his private and public capacities; therefore,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Matthew Haw- Securities to James O'Bryon, executor of James, David Lindsey, William Clayton, collect, &cc. Edward Wright, John K. Downes, Henry Pratt, Robert Waters and William Diamond, securities of Thomas O'Bryon aforesaid, or a majority of them, or the furvivors of them, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to colka, on or before the first day of January, seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, all balances owing as aforesaid to the said deceased sheriff and collector for the wars seventeen hundred and ninety-two, seventeen hundred and ninety-three, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, in manner following, to wit: That the parties of fuch person or persons as shall be deputed by them, or a pority of them, or the survivors of them, in the collection aforesaid, shall, at if thirty days before execution or diffress of property for the arrearages afored, deliver to the person charged, or leave at his or her last place of abode, an count, stating the taxes and the amount of fees due to the state and the officers pectively, or such part thereof as may be claimed as due, and the said securis, or a majority of them, or their agent, shall, if they be thereto required by me person so charged, make oath, before a justice of the peace, that the said count was taken fairly and truly from the books or papers of the faid Thomas Bryon, and that it doth not appear from the said books or papers, or by any norandum of the said Thomas O'Bryon, that any part or parcel of the charges ained in such account hath been paid, or otherwise secured or satisfied; and ne person or persons owing such taxes and officers sees shall neglect or resule by the same, it shall and may be lawful for the said securities, or a majority nem, or the survivors of them, to collect the same by execution or distress of rity of the person or persons so resuling or neglecting, and to sell and disthereof, at public auction, at the expiration of ten days, exclusive of the f seizure and day of sale, on giving ten days notice, by advertisement at the public places of the neighbourhood, and at the court-house door of the ty, of the day and hour of fale.

That all the books, memorandums and entries, of Books, &c. to be delivered, d sheriff and his deputies, in which his accounts as sheriff and collector &c. ted and kept, shall be delivered by James O'Bryon, junior, his administrathe said securities, or a majority of them, on demand, and shall be depothe hands of John Caradine, or such person as the securities may direct, treville, to be freely inspected and examined, without cost or charges, by fon or persons who shall apply for that purpose, in order to ascertain any nts that may have been made upon his, her or their account; and the said O'Bryon, junior, before he shall deliver the said books, memorandums
