C H A P. XLV.

An ACT to open a road from Middle-town to New-town, Trap Passed Januaor Freedom, in Frederick county.

THEREAS it is represented to this general affembly, by the petition Preamble. of fundry inhabitants of Frederick county, that they experience great inconvenience for want of a direct road from Middle-town to Newtown, Trap or Freedom, and praying a law may pass appointing commissioners to open a road, at the expence of the county, on the most direct course from Middle-town to New-town, Trap or Freedom; and it appearing that the same would be of great public convenience, therefore,

II. 25e it enacted, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Joseph Swear- Commissioningen, Frederick Stembell and Elias Delashmutt, be and they are hereby ap- ers appointed, &c. pointed commissioners for that purpose, and any two of them are hereby authorised to lay out and open, at the expence of Frederick county, a road, not exceeding twenty-five feet wide, from Middle-town to New-town, Trap or Freedom, in said county, in the most convenient direction they may think proper; and the faid road, when so laid out and completed, shall be recorded among the records of said county, and be thereafter deemed and taken to be a public road, and thall be kept in repair as other public roads in said county are directed to be kept.

III. And he it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid shall and they are Damages to reby directed to apply to any justice of the peace for the county aforesaid, who be ascertained, &c. all issue his warrant, under hand and seal, directed to any constable of the said ounty, commanding him to summon twelve freeholders, difinterested as to the inds, and not connected with any person through whose lands the said road may 16, to appear at a place and on a day by him to be appointed, and after taking e following eath, or affirmation, as the case may be, to wit: "I, A. B. do wear, or folemnly, fincerely and truly declare and affirm, that I will honestly and faithfully estimate and value the damage and injury sustained by C. D. by pening a road through the land of the said C. D. in pursuance of the direcdone of this act," shall proceed to ascertain and value what damages may be tained by any person or persons through whose land the said road may pass, by ning and clearing the same, and shall return the damages by him assessed to clerk of the faid county, and the damages so affested shall be conclusive; and the valuation so made, the said commissioners shall proceed to open and clear wame; provided that the faid road shall not pass through any houses, gardens, ards or meadows, unless with the consent of the owner thereof.
