Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate George- Passed Januatown, in Montgomery county.

THEREAS the citizens of George-town have, by their petition to this Preamble. general assembly, set forth, that they sustain many inconveniencies from the want of proper powers in said corporation to pass laws to drain the mischiess arising from vagrants, loose and disorderly persons, free nes, and persons having no visible means of support, and for the want of r powers for the due government of the affairs of the said town; therefore,
