An ACT for building a new gaol in Baltimore county. HEREAS by the petition of fundry inhabitants of Baltimore county it is represented to this general assembly, that the public gaol of the faid county is in a ruinous state, and in every respect unsit for use, and that a new gaol ought to be erected in faid county; therefore,

Preamble.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Samuel Ow- Commissionings, James Carroll, John Merryman, James Carey and Nicholas Rogers, shall ers appointed, be commissioners for the purpose of erecting a new gaol in the said county of Baltimore, upon the public ground in the city of Baltimore appropriated by law for the gaol and court-house of said county; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby empowered to contract for materials, and to agree with workmen, to build and finish the said gaol, which, when completed, shall by the said commissioners be put into the custody and possession of the sheriff of Baltimore county for the time being, and so shall remain and continue in the custod and possession of such sheriff, and his successors, as the public gaol of the faid county of Baltimore.

That the said commissioners, or a majority of them, Commissionbe and they are hereby empowered to borrow, from time to time, such sum money, &c. fums of money as they may conceive to be necessary, at an interest not exceedfix per centum per annum, which said loan or loans shall be appropriated and lied by them to the erecting of the faid gaol; and to receive the repayment of faid fum or fums of money, with the interest thereon, the said commissioners all be and they are hereby authorised to assign and transfer to the lender or ders thereof any part or parts of the before-mentioned taxes, to be annually lected as aforesaid, which lender or lenders shall, in such case, have all the ets and privileges in enforcing the payment to them of the said taxes that the missioners should have had if such transfer had not been made.
