C H A P. LXXXIII. fifteen per cent. so collected, shall be the only fund out of which the agent sind draw his commission of three per cent. for collecting the same; provided that the said agent shall not be entitled to any commission upon the monies arising from sines, forseitures, amerciaments, ordinary, retailers, marriage, hawkers and pedelers licences, unless in cases where the same shall not be paid by the sheriss and clerks respectively to the treasurer within one month after the time prescribed by law, and unless the said agent shall thereaster receive the same from the said of sincers respectively, and the same pay to the said treasurer.

Agent to give bond, &c.

XXIII. And he it enalted, That the said agent, before he enters upon the execution of the duties of this act, shall give bond to the state, before the governor and council, in the penalty of sixty thousand dollars, with such security as the governor and council shall approve, for the saithful performance of the said duties, which bond shall be lodged with the treasurer of the western shore, and shall also take an oath before the chancellor, that he will well and faithfully discharge the duties as agent under the act, entitled, An act to appoint an agent for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, to the best of his skill and judgment, the certificate of which oath shall be annexed to, or endorsed on, the said bond.

How a vacancy is to be filled. XXIV. And be it enabled. That if the said agent shall not accept his appointment, or if after his acceptance he shall not give bond, and take the oath aforesaid, before the first day of Fébruary next, or shall die, the governor and council are hereby authorised and requested to appoint a fit and proper person in his place, who shall have and execute all the authorities and powers vested in the said William Marbury by this act, such person first giving security, and taking the oath aforesaid.

C H A P. LXXXIV.

Passed January 20.

A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act respecting the roads of Somerset and Worcester counties.

Preamble.

HEREAS, through mistake, the act, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, and the supplements thereto, so far as relates to Somer-set county, was omitted to be repealed in the act, entitled, An act respecting the roads of Somerset and Worcester counties, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-six; therefore,

Parts of acts repealed.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the act of assembly passed at November session, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, entitled, An act relating to public roads in this state, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, and the supplements thereto, so far as relates to Somerset county, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Acts extended, &c. - III. And he it enaited. That an act passed at October session, seventeen hundred and fifty-three, entitled, An act for repairing public roads in this province and the supplement thereto, and the several clauses and provisions thereof, he and the same are hereby extended to the county of Somerset, to all intents and purposes, any law or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

Persons exempt, &c. IV. And he it enamed, That in Somerfet county all persons under sixteen upwards of sifty years of age, shall be exempt from working on the public roof said county, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
