now-Hill, near Mary Parker's on the west side of said river, to the Queponco oad on the east side of said river, and passes near Elisha Purnell's plantation, has been opened and repaired at the expence of individuals, but is of great public convenience, and have petitioned that the faid road should be considered a oublic road, and repaired as such; and the prayer of the petition appearing to this general affembly reasonable and just, therefore,

CHAP.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Messieurs Commission-William Morris, Elisha Purnell and James Houston, be and are hereby appoint- ers appointed, &c. ed commissioners for the purposes of this act; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised to open and clear, at least twenty seet wide, the faid road, and the faid road, so opened and cleared, (after the valuation herein after directed to be made, or the damages herein after directed to be afsessed, shall be paid or secured to the individuals concerned,) shall be recorded among the records of Worcester county, and shall for ever thereafter be deemed a public road, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as other public mads are kept in faid county.

III. And be it enacted, That the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of Damages to them, shall ascertain and value what damages may be sustained by any person or be ascertained, and through whose lands the said and the persons through whose lands the said road may pass by opening and clearing the ame, and the said valuation shall be made and paid before the commissioners shall proceed to open and clear the same; and in case any proprietor or proprietors hall conceive him, her or themselves aggrieved by the valuation of the said commissioners, or shall be an infant, feme-covert, or non compos mentis, it shall and may be lawful for the said commissioners, on the application of any person inmested, to apply to any justice of the peace for Worcester county, who shall thereupon issue his warrant, under hand and seal, to the constable of the hundred wherein such lands may be, commanding him to summon twelve freeholders, difinterested in the said road, and not related to the owner or owners, to appear on a day by him to be appointed on the said lands, at which time such freeholders, so summoned, shall respectively appear before such justice, and take the following oath, or affirmation, viz. "I, A. B. do Iwear, or affirm, that I will "honestly value the damage and injury sustained by C. D. by opening a road "through the lands of the said C. D. in pursuance of this act, having regard to "all the conveniencies and disadvantages attending the same;" and shall return minquisition of such damages by them assessed to the clerk of the county court of Worcester, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive.

IV. And be it enacted, That the persons who may conceive themselves interest. To be paid to ed or benefitted by faid road, are hereby required to pay into the hands of the fioners, &c. commissioners aforesaid, for the use of the person or persons in whose favour such valuation may be made, immediately upon laying out the road aforesaid, whatwer damages be as aforesaid adjudged to the party sustaining such damages, and n cale of failure of payment as aforesaid, this act to be null and void, but in ale of compliance with the provisions of this act, the said road to be considered public road, and to be kept up as other public roads in said county.
