C H A P. XXV.

An ACT, for the establishment of a new public road in Somerset county. HEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of fundry inhabitants Preamble of Someriet county, that considerable inconvenience is experienced from the want of a new public road, to lead from the main road near Samuel Green's fence until it interfects the public road leading from Little Creek towards the mouth of Rewastico, near the plantation of John Killum; therefore,

H. BUIT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That William Russum, James Wea- Commissioners thorly, Horatio Stayton, Arthur Dashiell, junior, and William Betsworth, be and they are herewappointed commissioners, or any three or more of them, are hereby authorised to lay out and ben as aforefaid, at the expence of the subscribers to the faid road, a public road, in the most onvenient direction, not exceeding thirty feet wide, from or near Samuel Green's fence, in inherset county, to a place near the plantation of John Killum; and the said road, when so said ar and completed at the expence of the faid subscribers, and after the valuations herein after frected to be made, or the damages hereby directed to be affeffed, thall be paid or fecured to be mid to the individuals concerned, shall be recorded among the records of Somerset county court, and be thereafter deemed and taken to be a public road, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as other public roads are directed to be kept in faid county.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners may appoint one of their number as Who are to apmeasurer, who is hereby enjoined and empowered to collect and receive all monies subscribed, or point a treasuhat may be subscribed, for the purpose of laying out and clearing the faid road, and such subimbers are hereby directed to pay their feveral subscriptions to the treasurer appointed as aforeaid; and if any person shall neglect or resuse to pay his subscription money, the said treasurer, or my one of the faid commissioners in the name of the whole, may and is hereby authorised to sue fir, recover and receive the fame; and the faid monies when received, fliall be applied by the and commissioners, or any three of them, to the purposes of this act.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforefaid shall ascertain and value what damages may be fullained by any person or persons through whose land the faid road may pass, by meming and clearing the same, and the said valuation shall be made before the said commissioners proceed to open and clear the fame; and in cafe any proprietor or proprietors, or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by the valuation of the said commissioners, ithall and may be lawful for any justice of the peace for Somerset county, on application by any person interested, to lifue his warrant, under his hand and feal, directed to any constable of the bunty, commanding him to fummon twelve good and lawful men, difinterested as to the faid mad, to ferve as a jury, to appear on a day by him the faid justice of the peace to be appointed, on the land of the person making application as afcresaid, and the said persons summoned as prors shall respectively repair to some judice of the peace of the faid county, and take the folbwing oath, or affirmation, to wit: " I, A. B. do fwel r, or folemnly, fincerely and truly declare "and affirm, that I will honeftly and faithfully estimate and value the damage and injury sustained by C. D. by opening a road through the land of the faid C. D. in pursuance of an act of af-"fembly," and shall return the damages by them assessed to the faid justice of the peace, and such murn thall be conclusive; and the party or parties in whose favour such valuation is ascertained y the faid commissioners, or damages affested by the jury aforefaid, shall be entitled to receive the same from the said commissioners; and the said commissioners shall pay, or secure to be paid; the amount of the faid valuation or damages to the respective parties entitled to receive the ame, out of the monies to be raifed and collected from the fubicriptions to faid road, within the space of six months after the ascertainment of such valuation or damages, and before they hall proceed to affect the lands and tenements of the person or persons concerned; provided, hat the faid road shall not go through any houses, gardens, meadows or orchards, unless with the confent of the owner thereof.
