C H A P. XXVII.

An ACT for the benefit of Richard Ireland Jones, of Queen-Anne's county. THEREAS Richard Ireland Jones, late of the kingdom of Great-Britain, now of Queen- Preamble. Anne's county, fome years past came into this state with a bona fide intention to rende increin, and hath fince married and acquired confiderable real estate: And whereas the faid achard Ireland Jones took the oaths of naturalization prescribed by the laws of this state, and be act of congress of November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, entitled, An act eltablish an uniform rule of naturalization, and to repeal the act heretofore passed on that poject, in order to become a citizen of this state, and of the United States, and doubts have fullen, whether the purchases, sales and contracts, of and for real estate, made and executed by faid Richard Ireland Jones, previous to his naturalization agreeably to the faid act of con-Fres, are good and valid; therefore,

II. BE IT ENAGTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all conveyances, purchases and Conveyances, ontracts, touching or concerning real estate lying in the state of Maryland, made, executed or &c to have of entered into, by or to the faid Richard Ireland Jones, fince his coming into this state, shall have the fame effect, operation and validity, as if the faid Richard Ireland Jones had been naturalized at the time the same were executed or entered into; provided, that nothing in this act contained hall affect the rights of third persons accruing before the passage of this act.

C H A P.

An ACT for changing part of the divisional road between Somerset and Wor- Passed Jan. 15. cester counties, and for changing part of a road in Worcester county called the Black-foot road.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of George Parker, of Preamble.

Somerset county, that he is notified of fundry trade of Line in C. Somerfet county, that he is possessed of fundry tracts of land in Somerfet and Worcester counties, through which the divisional road of Someriet and Worcester counties, and the Blackfoot road, now run, to the great injury of the faid George Parker: And whereas it appears that Langing the faid roads will redound to the interest of the said George Parker, and promote the convenience of the public; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Dashiell, of Jesse, William Commissioners Heron, James Weatherly Waller, William Chaille and Levin Handy, of Rhode-Island, be and appointed, &c. they are hereby appointed commissioners, or any three or more of them are hereby authorised thange, lay out and open, at the expence of the said George Parker, two public roads, in the most convenient directions, not exceeding thirty feet wide, one of faid roads to lead from or war Parker's mills towards Salisbury, so far as the faid George Parker's lands may extend, if meessary, and the other public road to lead from or near Parker's mills aforesaid towards Blackt, fo far as the faid Parker's lands extend, if necessary; and the faid roads, when laid out and completed at the expence of the faid George Parker aforefaid, shall be recorded among the rewinds of Somerfet and Worcester county courts, and shall be thereafter deemed and taken as public roads for ever, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as the present public roads

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That after the public road aforefuld to lead from or near Parker's Road to be mils towards Salisbury shall be laid out and completed as aforesaid, it shall be taken and deemed, n the same manner as the old road, the division between Somerset and Worcester counties, so as the faid road extends, for ever thereafter.

C H A P. XXIX.

ACT for the benefit of Stephen White, and others, of Worcester county. Passed Jan. 15. HEREAS Stephen White, of Worcester county, for himself and others, proprietors of Preamble. stages running from Philadelphia to Norfolk, by the way of Dover and Snow-Hill, has atitioned this affembly for liberty to make use of their flaves as drivers of the faid stages from his state to another state, and from another state to this, without their becoming free by the ws of this state; and the prayer of the said petitioner appearing reasonable, therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That it shall be lawful for any of the Slaves may be prietors of the stages aforesaid to make use of their slaves as drivers aforesaid from this state used as drivers, another state, or from another state to this, without their becoming free, any law of this state &c. the contrary notwithstanding; provided always, that every driver as aforesaid, being a slave, be recorded agreeably to the act of revenced fundamental mentioned; and provided also, that thing to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned; and provided also, that be recorded agreeably to the act of feventeen hundred and ninety-fix, entitled, An act rew flave, being once recorded as aforefaid, the master of such slave shall thereafter have a right wemploy him as a driver at pleafure.

C H A P. XXX.

An ACT to incorporate the baptist church in the city of Baltimore, HEREAS application hath been made to this general assembly, by the baptist church in Preamble. the city of Baltimore, now under the pastoral charge of the reverend Lewis Richards, to porate a committee of the faid church, with powers adequate to the management of their poral concerns,

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the present committee of the Committee, &c. hurch, viz. David Shield, George Prettman, Alexander M'Kim, William Wilson and Mat-incorporated, Maris, and their fuccessors, to be chosen as herein after is mentioned, together with the ter of the faid church for the time being, shall be and hereby are created and declared weller.
