a body politic and corporate, by the name, flyle and title, of The Committee of the Ban CHAP. Church in the City of Baltimore, and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and it XXX. be able to fue or be fued, to implead and be impleaded, in any court of law or equity in the state, or elsewhere, and to make and use a common seal, and the same to break, after or renew at their pleafure, and also to ordain and establish such by laws and ordinances as to them the appear necessary for regulating and managing the temporal concerns of the faid church, not repugnant to this act, to the laws of the state, or of the United States, and for promoting literation ture in the faid church.

Successors, how to be cholen, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the fuccessors of the present committee shall be chosen in the following manner, viz. The male members of the faid church may and shall meet at their men ing-house, or such other place in the city of Baltimore as may be appointed by the faid corporation, on the first Monday in May, or any other Monday of the same month, in the year eighteen hundred, and they may and shall continue to meet in like manner on the first Monday of May, or any other Monday of the fame month, every year thereafter, of which meetings due notice shall always be given by the prefident of the faid corporation for the time being, on the forenoon of the two feveral Sunday next preceding the day of fuch meeting, at the place where public wor. thip is usually performed by the faid church, and then and there they, or so many of them as may attend, shall elect, viva voce, five lay members of the faid church as a committee, who shall continue to act as fuch for one year, and until others shall be elected in their room.

How vacancies

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That in case of the death, removal or resignation, of any lay mem. are to be filled. ber of the faid body corporate, the remaining members thereof, or a majority of them, shall have full power and authority, at their next or any subsequent meeting, to elect another person in his place.

Lands vested, æε.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all the lands and tenements, with their appertenances, now held in trust for the use of the said church or congregation, and all other property of the said church or congregation, shall be and hereby are absolutely and unconditionally vested in the said body corporate, and their fuccessors, for ever; and the faid corporation, (with the consent of a. majority of the members thereof,) are hereby declared to be capable of bargaining and felling, leafing and conveying, any part of the faid property, or any other property which may hereafter be acquired by the faid corporation, in as full, ample and effectual a manner, as any moral per. fon or body corporate may or can do.

Minister to prefide, &c.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That at all meetings of the faid corporation the minister for the time being shall preside, and in case of the absence, removal or death, of the minister, the lay members of the corporation may appoint one of their own body prefident pro tempore, who, during fuch absence, or in the case of removal or death until the appointment of another minister, shall a have all the privileges and authority of the president.

President to appoint perions,

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the prefident shall nominate and appoint three persons to be the judges of each and every election that shall or may be held for electing the lay members of the faid corporation, and that fuch nomination and appointment shall be made a reasonable time before every such election.

Acts to be figned, &c.

VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all acts or deeds of the faid corporation shall be figned by the president in behalf of the body corporate, and sealed with the corporate seal, and all deeds by the body corporate, for the conveyance of lands and tenements, which by the laws of the state ought to be recorded, shall be signed and sealed as aforesaid, and shall also be acknowledged in due form by the prefident, as fuch, in behalf of the corporation; and all acts or deeds of the faid body corporate, so authenticated, shall be valid and effectual in law.

Account to be rendered, &c.

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the prefent committee of the faid church, and each and every fucceeding committee that shall be chosen in virtue of this act, shall, within a reasonable time after each election for the committee, render to their fuccessors respectively an exact account of all the monies by them had and received, difburfed and paid away, on account of the corporation, together with a general account of their transactions, and statement of the concerns of the inflitution, and shall moreover pay, hand over and deliver up, to their successors respectively, the balance of all monies remaining unexpended in their hands, together with the books of account of the corporation, and all notes, bonds, and other evidences of debt thereunto belonging, or in anywife appertaining.

Corporation may purchase,

X. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid corporation shall be able and capable hereafter to purchase, receive, hold and enjoy, any estate, real, personal or mixed, not exceeding six thousand fand dollars.

C H A P. XXXI. An ACT for the relief of Philip Edwards, of Baltimore county.

Preamble.

THEREAS Philip Edwards, of Baltimore county, has stated to this general assembly in a inability to pay his debts, and has petitioned for an act to release him therefrom ungiving up all his property to the use of his creditors: And whereas the said Philip Edward being an officer in the navy of the United States, is liable, from the military arrangements, be called out of this state, which justifies a distinction of his case from others who have petitions for fimilar acts;

Oath to be inken, &c.

H. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That in case the said Philip Edmin shall, before some justice of the peace for the county where he resides, make and subscribe following oath, to wit: " I, Philip Edwards, do swear, or affirm, that I will deliver up, conve
