Passed Jan. 15. An ACT for building a new gaol in Dorchester county, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

Preumble

THEREAS by the petition of fundry inhabitants of Dorchester county it is represented. this general affembly, that there is no gaol in Dorcheller county fufficient for the con finement of debtors or felons, which is very injurious to the peace and fecurity of the faid comty; and it appearing also that there are confiderable sums of money due said country for property fold for the use of the fame,

H. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Moles Lecompte, James Steel-Commissioners to contract, &c. John F. Gift, Levin Woolford and Thomas Ennalls, or the major part of them, shall contract, &c. for materials, and agree with workmen, to build and finith the faid gaol, which shall be eredulated to the faid gaol. in the town of Cambridge, and to plan and superintend the faid building until finished, which when completed, shall, by the said commissioners, be put into the custody and possession of the theriff of Dorchester county for the time being, and so shall remain and continue in the custody and possession of such therist, and his successors, as a public gaol for Dorchester county.

Money raifed to be paid to them, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the fum or fums of money raised on the fales of property be longing to faid county, under an act of assembly pailed at November fession, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Don. chefter county to affefs and levy a fum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, shall be and the same is hereby directed to be, paid to the commissioners, or a majority of them, who are authorifed to receive and apply the same to the crecting and building of a gaol in laid county.

Justices to levy money.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the justices of the levy court for Dorchester county, at the time of laying their next county levy, be and they are hereby authorifed and directed to impose on the affeffable property of the faid county a lum not exceeding fixteen hundred dollars, to gether with an allowance to the collector of fix per cent. for collection of the same, which sum when collected, shall by the said sheriff be paid to the commissioners aforesaid, or the major pand of them, to be by them applied in the erecting of faid gaol.

To be paid to commissioners.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the sheriss, or any other person appointed to collect the sail fum of money for the purpose aforesaid, shall pay the same to the said commissioners, or the on der of the major part of them, at or before the time limitted by law for the payment of the county charge in the year feventeen hundred and ninety-nine.

If not paid fuit to be brought,

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if the collector or theriff, as the case may be, should not pay the faid sum of money to the commissioners, or the order of a major part of them, on the day above mentioned, that it shall be the duty of the said commissioners, or a majority of them to order a copy of the faid theriff's or collector's bond, as the case may be, to be filed in the clerk's office of the court of Dorchester county, and thereupon a common capias ad respondending shall iffue, and judgment or trial be had at the first court to which the capies is returnable, with out any imparlance or delay.

Old gael to be fold, &c.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners, or a majority of them, be and they and hereby empowered to dispose of the old gaol of the said county, with the lot of ground on which the same at present stands, or the said commissioners, or a majority of them, may sell the god house separately from the said lot, or apply and use the materials of the old gaol towards build ing the new gaol, at their differetion, the faid lot of ground to be fold at public auction, in hud manner and form, and at fuch time and times, as the faid commissioners may think proper.

Account to be rendered.

VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners, or a majority of them, shall renders full and fair account to the levy court of faid county of the receipts and expenditures of all monies which shall be by them received and expended in virtue of this act.

How vacancies to be filled:

IX. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any of the faid commissioners shall die, remove out of the ounty, or refuse to act, the residue, or a majority of them, shall immediately thereafter process to nominate and appoint another to fill the vacancy, whose acts is fuch shall be as valid fectual as if he had been originally named in this law.

An ACT relating to the public roads in Somerset county.

7 HEREAS the present laws relative to the public roads of Somerset county are at present complex, and in part inadequate to the purposes for which they were intended; and as a ceffary that the law should be rendered plain, therefore is necessary that the law should be rendered plain, therefore,

Justices to meet, &c.

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the justices of the peace for the county alorefaid, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorifed and required to met. together on the first Monday of April next, and on the same day in every year thereafter, -- + the court-house in the said county, and when so met together, the said justices, or a majority them, shall be and they are hereby authorised and required to describe, ascertain, and distinction, record in a well bound book to be provided by them for that purpose, the several and respecting a public roads in Somerfet county, and to nominate and appoint capable and proper perform overfeers of the feveral and respective public roads aforesaid, according to the number and divisions of the faid roads, as the same shall be ascertained upon their records; provided never theless, that the said roads shall be so apportioned, divided and described, as not to require greater number of overfeers than eight in any one hundred of the faid county; and that the fair
