BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That William Chaille, John Dashiell, Commissioners sonathan Parson, John Flint and William Toadwine, be and they are hereby authorised to open appointed, &c. and clear the faid road, thirty feet wide, in the manner following, viz. The faid road leading from the interfection of Christopher's road with the main road leading from Snow-Hill to Salifbury to the main road dividing Somerset and Worcester counties as aforesaid, and the said roads, hopened and cleared, after the valuation herein after directed to be made, or the damages herein after directed to be assessed, shall be paid or secured to the individuals concerned, shall be morded among the records of Worcester county, shall for ever thereafter be deemed a public mad, and shall be kept in repair in the same manner as other public roads are kept in the said county.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners aforesaid, or a majority of them, shall as- Who shall ascertain and value what damages may be fustained by any person or persons through whose land certain damages are the faid road may pass, by opening and clearing the same, and the said valuation thall be made and paid before the commissioners shall proceed to open and clear the same; and in case any proprietor or proprietors shall conceive him, her or themselves aggrieved by the valuation of the hid commissioners, or shall be an infant, feme-covert, or non compotes mentis, it shall and may be lawful for the faid commissioners, on the application of any person interested, to apply to any whice of the peace for the county of Worcester, who shall thereupon issue his warrant, under is hand and feal, to the constable of the hundred wherein such lands may be, commanding him w summon twelve freeholders, disinterested in the said road, to appear on a day by him to be appointed on the faid lands, at which time fuch freeholders, fo fummoned, shall respectively appear before fuch justice, and take the following oath, or affirmation, viz. " I, A. B. do fwear, or affirm, that I will honestly value the damages and injury fustained by opening a road through the lands of the faid C. D. in pursuance of this act," and shall return an inquisition of such damages by them affessed to the clerk of the county court of Worcester, and the damages so aflessed shall be conclusive.

AND BE IT ENACTED, That the persons who may conceive themselves interested or bene- Persons beneitted by fuch road are hereby required to pay into the hands of the commissioners aforesaid, for sitted to pay, the use of the person or persons in whose favour such valuation may be made, immediately upon laying out the road aforesaid, whatever damages be as aloresaid adjudged to the party sustaining such damages, and in case of failure of payment as aforesaid, this act to be null and void, but in use of compliance with the provisions of this act, the faid road to be considered as a public mad, and to be kept up as a public road in faid county.
