BE IT ENAUTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the justices of Harford county Justices to lovy hall be and they are hereby directed and empowered, at their courts annually as long as they, in money. their differetion, may think proper, to affels and levy on faid county a fum of money, not exceeding forty dollars, for the support and maintenance of Elizabeth Morrison, the faid lunatic, and that the faid fum be collected and paid annually to the aforefaid Mary Morrison, or fuch other person as the faid levy court may direct, by the collector or collectors of Harford county, for the purpose aforefaid, agreeable to the orders of the levy court of faid county.

An ACT to prevent the going at large of geese and swine in the towns of Passed Jan. 15.

DE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That from and after the first day of March, No geese, &c. D in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, no geese or swine to go at large, shall be suffered to go at large in the towns of Upper-Marlborough or Nottingham, in Prince-George's county; and if any person shall find any geose or swine going at large in the towns of Upper-Marlborough or Nottingham aforesaid, it shall and may be lawful for such person to kill, or cause to be killed, such geese or swine.

II. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any person shall be sued for killing any swine or geese going Persons sued at large in the towns of Upper-Marlborough or Nottingham aforefaid, fuch person may plead the may plead, &c. general iffue, and give this act and the special matter in evidence.
