An ACT for the relief of Ralph Ormston, of Washington county. WHEREAS Ralph Ormston, of Washington county, has emigrated to, and settled in, this Preamble. state, and fince his emigration and settlement in this state has acquired real property therein: And whereas his title to fuch property, from his not having been naturalized before inch property was acquired by him, may be called in question, to his great injury and detriment; therefore,

IL BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the title to all the real property Title vefted, wfully and fairly acquired by the aforefaid Ralph Ormston, whether such title be derived by &c. nt, gift, purchase or devise, be and the same is hereby as amply and as fully vested in the Ralph Ormston, to all intents and purposes, as if he had been naturalized before his title to wh real property had been acquired; saving nevertheless, to all persons whatsoever who may e acquired, under the laws of this state, a title to any part of the real estate held by the said. clions, or either of thom, or any persona or persona claiming under them, or either of them.
