Beatty, of Montgomery county, Benjamin Murrow, James Forbes and George Lynn, of Allegany county, and fuch persons as they may from time to time elect, and their successors, are hereby declared to be one community, corporation and body politic, for ever, by and under the name and title of the Medical and Chirurgical Faculty of the State of Maryland, and by and under the same name and title they shall be able and capable in law to purchase, take, have and enjoy, to them and their successors, in see, or for less estate or estates, any lands, tenements, rents, annuities chattels, bank stock, registered debts, or other public securities within this state, by the gift, bargain, sale or devise, of any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, capable to make the same, and the same at their pleasure to alien, sell, transfer or lease, and apply to such purposes as they may adjudge most conducive to the promoting and disseminating medical and surgical cal knowledge, or to alleviating the calamities and miseries of their fellow-citizens; provided new vertheless, that the said faculty or body politic shall not, at any one time, hold or possess property. real, personal or mixed, exceeding in total value the sum of ten thousand dollars per annum.

First meeting to be at Annapolis, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the members of the faid faculty above defignated may and small hold their first meeting at the city of Annapolis on the first Monday in June next, or as soon thereafter as a number not less than fifteen of them can be convened, at which meeting they may appoint a president, a secretary and treasurer, make a common seal, and may elect into their body fuch medical and chirurgical practitioners within this state as they may think qualified to become members of the faculty.

IV. And BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful for the said medical faculty, or any twelve persons, number of them then attending, (not less than fifteen,) to elect by ballot twelve persons of the greatest medical and chirurgical abilities in the state, who shall be styled the Medical Board of Examiners for the State of Maryland, seven of whom shall be residents of the western and sive of the eastern shore of Maryland, whose duty it shall be to grant licences to such medical and chirurgical gentlemen as they, either upon a full examination, or upon the production of diplomat from some respectable college, may judge adequate to commence the practice of the medical and chirurgical arts, each person so obtaining a certificate to pay a sum not exceeding ten dollars, to be fixed on or ascertained by the faculty.

Five examiners to be a board, &c.

V. And BE IT ENACTED, That any five of the examiners appointed for the western, and any three of those appointed for the eastern shore, shall constitute a board on their respective shores for examining such candidates as may apply on the faid shores respectively, and shall subscribe their names to each certificate by them granted, which certificate shall be also countersigned by the president of the faculty, and have the seal of the faculty affixed thereto by the secretary, upon the payment into the hands of the treasurer of the sum of money to be ascertained as above by the faculty; and any one of faid examiners may grant a licence to practife until a board, in informity to this act, can be held.

No perion to practife with-

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That after the appointment of the aforefaid medical board, no perfon, not already a practitioner of medicine or furgery, shall be allowed to practife in either of out licence, &c. the faid branches and receive payment for his services, without having first obtained a licence, certified as by this law directed, under the penalty of fifty dollars for each offence, to be recovered in the county court where he may reside by bill of presentment and indictment, one half for the use of the faculty, and the other for that of the informer.

Persons to pay, &c.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That every porson who, upon application, shall be elected a mene ber of the medical faculty, thall pay a flim not exceeding ten dollars, to be afcertained by the faculty.

Persons to pay, &c.

VIII. And BE IT ENACTED, That every person who, upon application, shall be elected a member of the medical faculty, shall pay a sum not exceeding ten dollars, to be ascertained by the faculty.

Paculty to make by-laws,

IX. And he it enacted, That the faid medical faculty be and they are hereby empowered, from rime to time, to make fuch by laws, rules and regulations, as they may find requisite; to break or after their common feal; to he the times and places for their general meetings, for the meeting
