shall acquire in his own right, by descent, gift, bequest, devise, or in course of distribution, shall be liable to the payment of his debts.

CHAP.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the trustee in virtue of this act shall, in the first place, apply the Liens to befirst proceeds of the property of the said Tristram Dalton which shall come to the hands of such trustee discharged, &c. or trustees to the fatisfaction and discharge of liens heretofore created thereon, and after the discharge of fuch liens, the refidue among his feveral creditors, in equal proportions to their feveral debts; and the interest, share or part, of the said Tristram Dalton, in any property or debt held by, or due to, any co-partnership, shall be applied, in the first place, to the satisfaction and discharge of fuch co-partnership debts.

V. AND BE IT ENACTED, That any trustee or trustees to be appointed in virtue of this act, before Trustee to give he or they shall proceed to act as such, shall give bond, with security, to be approved of by the bond, &c. chancellor, for the faithful execution of the trult reposed in him or them, and pursue in all respects the directions of the chancellor in the performance of the faid truft.

VI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if any of the creditors of the faid Tristram Dalton shall, on the T. Dalton mag application of the faid Tristram Dalton to the chancellor, or within two years thereafter, allege in be examined, writing that the faid Triftram Dalton has, directly or indirectly, fold, conveyed, lessened, or other- &c. wife dispoted of, or purchased in trust for himself, or any other person or persons, or intrusted or concealed, any part of his property, debts or effects, with intent to injure or defraud his creditors, or any of them, or to expect, secure or receive, any benefit or advantage therefrom, the chancellor, at the election of such creditor, may either examine the said Tristram Dalton on oath, on such allegations, or direct an issue in a summary way, without the form of an action, for trying the truth of the same; and if upon the answer of the said Tristram Dalton in the trial of the issue, he shall be found guilty of any fraud or deceit of his creditors, he shall for ever be precluded from any benefit of this act, and if the said Triftram Dalton shall, at any time thereafter, upon indictment, be convicted of wilfully, falfely and corruptly fwearing to any matter or thing to which he shall swear by virtue of this act, he shall suffer as in case of wilful and corrupt perjury.

VII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if the faid Triftram Dalton shall be arrested or imprisoned on any If arrested, may process sued out on any judgment or decree obtained against him for any debt, damage or costs, due, be discharged, contracted, owing, or growing due before the passing this act, the court out of which such process issued shall and may discharge the said Tristram Dalton on motion; and if the said Tristram Dalton shall be fued, arrested or imprisoned, on any mesne process for the recovery of any debt or damages, contracted, owing, or growing due before the passing this act, the court before whom such process shall be returned shall and may discharge the said Tristram Dalton out of custody on his common appearance being entered, without any special bail.

VIII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid Triftram Dalton shall not be entitled to the benefit of Affent of crethe provisions of this act, unless, at the time of presenting his petition as aforesaid, he shall produce ditors to be produced, &c. to the chancellor the assent of two thirds in value of his creditors who are citizens of this state, or of the United States, at the time of passing this act.

An ACT to lay out a road from the Morgan-town road, on the ridge Jan. 1800. I ween Aza Beall's and William Coddington's, to the Virginia

line, near the lands of John Forreit.

WHEREAS fundry inhabitants of Allegany county, by their petition to this general assembly Preamble. have set forth, that they labour under many inconveniencies for the want of a public road, 'o leave the Morgan-town road on the ridge between Aza Beall's and William Goddington's, and from thence to the line that divides the state of Maryland and Virginia, near the lands of John Forrest, and have prayed that a road may be laid out and opened in faid direction at their expence, which appearing to this assembly reasonable; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That Jeffe Tomlinson, George Lynn and Commissioners Basil Israel, or any two of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to survey and lay appointed, &c. out, at the expence of the petitioners, a road, not exceeding thirty feet in width, from the Morgantown road, on the ridge between Aza Beall's and William Coddington's, to the dividing line between
