CHAP. LXII. Repository to be fulleddown,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affembly of Maryland, That the justices of the levy court of Prince-George's county are hereby authorifed and empowered to pull down, or cause to be pulled down, the repository of the register of wills, fell the materials of the same, and to apply the money towards the creeling of a new gaol; and until an office shall be prepared in the new court-house for the register of wills of the faid county, the justices of the levy court be authorised and required to provide a fuitable apartment for the prefervation of the papers belonging to the faid office, and to levy the expences thereof in like manner as other county charges.

An ACT to lay out and open a public road in the upper part of Queen-Anne's county.

Preamble.

HEREAS fundry inhabitants of Queen-Anne's county, by their petition to this general affembly have fet forth, that they fullain great inconvenience from the want of a public road from Richard Tilghman's, the fourth's, gate, flanding on the fide of the main road leading from Church Hill to the Beaver Dams, in the upper part of Queen-Anne's county, to interfect the main road leading from Church Hill to Sudler's crofs-roads, by Joseph McConlkin's, in faid county; therefore,

Commissioners

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Affendly of Maryland, That Cornelius Comegys, Elisha Deford, appointed, &c. Thomas Seegar, Levi Sparks and John Brown Hackett, or any three of them, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to survey, lay out and open, at the expence of the petitioners, a road not exceeding thirty feet in width, clear of ditches, from the gate of Richard Tilghman, the fourth, until it shall intersect the public road leading from Church Itill to Sudler's cross-roads, by Joseph M'Conikin's, in faid county; and a plot of the faid road, when to furveyed and laid out, shall be returned to Queen-Anne's county court, to be recorded, and shall for ever thereafter be deemed and taken to be a public highway, and repaired and improved in the fame manner as other public roads in faid county.

Damages to be afcertained, &c.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall ascertain and value what damages may be fustained by any person or persons through whose land the said road shall pass, and the same, when so ascertained and assessed, shall be paid, or secured to be paid, by the said petitioners, before the faid commissioners shall proceed to open the faid road; provided always, that if any person or persons through whose land the said road shall pals, or his, her or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by such valuation and assessment of damages by the said commissioners, it shall and may be lawful for the said commissioners, or any two of them, to issue their warrant to the sheriff of the county, to summon twelve freeholders of the county, not interested in the premises, and qualified to ferve as jurors in the county court, to appear on the premifes, on a day by them to be appointed; and the faid commissioners are hereby authorised to administer an oath to every person so summoned, that he will, without favour, affection, prejudice or partiality, affess the damages fustained by the person or persons at whose request such inquisition shall be taken, by reason of opening the aforefaid road through his, her or their land; and the persons so summoned and sworn shall thereupon proceed to value and assess the damages accordingly, of which the said petitioners, or some one of them, shall have at least five days previous notice; and such inquisition shall be final and conclusive between the parties.

Not to go thro' buildings, &c.

IV. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the faid commissioners shall not lay out or open the faid road through the buildings, gardens, orchards or meadows, of any person without his or her consent.

An ACT to lay out certain roads from Andrew Gore and James Cooper's mill, in Baltimore county.

I reamble.

THEREAS it appears, by the petition of Andrew Gore and James Cooper to this general affembly, that they labour under great inconvenience for want of a road from their mill to the road leading from Elias Brown's plantation to Elk-Ridge Landing, and a road from the faid mill to interfect the old road leading from the city of Baltimore to Frederick-town, at or near John Cord's blackfmith's shop, in Anne-Arundel county; and this general assembly thinking the prayer of said petition reasonable,

Commissioners II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Thomas Buiseman, Orlando G. appointed, &c. Dorsey, Johnsa Dorsey, Vachel Dorsey, of Vachel, and Henry Cord, or any three of them, be and
