

R E S O L U T I O N S :

Perry, late of Talbot county, deceased, on the twenty-third of March, seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, the sum of three hundred and one pounds ten shillings and three-pence, being an over payment made by them for confiscated property purchased of the state, arising from a deficiency of one hundred and forty-three acres in the land purchased, as appears by the certificate of survey returned by John Brown Hackett, appointed to make the survey; **RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore pay the said sum of three hundred and one pounds ten shillings and three-pence, with interest from the twenty-third day of March last, to the said William Hindman, Gabriel Duvall, and the legal representatives of William Perry, or either of them, on application.

RESOLVED, That George Twilly, senior, of Somerset county, be and he is hereby released and discharged from the payment of seventeen pounds six shillings and nine-pence, being the valuation money of certain improvements by him made on a parcel of vacant land in the county aforesaid, and for which the said George Twilly obtained a warrant of resurvey from the land-office on the eastern shore.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay unto John Ryan, of Cæcil county, or his order, the sum of thirty-three pounds nine shillings and six-pence, being an over payment for confiscated property, with interest thereon from the fifteenth day of June, seventeen hundred and eighty-five.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay unto Archibald Robinson and Thomas Barton, administrators of James Barton, deceased, of Harford county, or their order, the sum of three pounds three shillings and four-pence, with interest from the twenty-first day of September, seventeen hundred and eighty-five, it being an over payment by James Barton, deceased, and his administrators, for confiscated property.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay unto John Whiteford, of Harford county, or his order, the sum of eleven pounds six shillings and five-pence, being an over payment for lands purchased in said county from the late intendant, with interest thereon from the first day of September, seventeen hundred and ninety-nine.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Richard J. Orme, or order, the sum of thirty-five pounds thirteen shillings and nine-pence current money, being the amount of the sum paid by him to persons having claims against a certain Alice Smith, whose land the said Orme escheated, and which he has obtained a patent for.

RESOLVED, That the auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to liquidate, ascertain and adjust, the amount of certificates and money that have been paid by Elizabeth Atkinson, deceased, for the real estate of Isaac Atkinson, purchased by her under the impresson that it was subject to confiscation, but which the chancellor has since determined was not liable to be confiscated, and that the said certificates be liquidated and adjusted at the rate at which they were received into the treasury, and that the treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay the amount thereof, with interest from the time of payment into the treasury, to the representatives of the said Elizabeth Atkinson, deceased, or their order.

RESOLVED, That William Kilty include in the edition of the laws which he is now compiling under the resolutions of the last general assembly, and agreeably thereto, the acts passed during the present session.

RESOLVED, That the sheriff of Baltimore county be and he is hereby directed to contract with the trustees of the poor-house of said county for the cloathing, maintenance and support, of negro Daniel, during his natural life, the said negro being the property of this state, and now under the care of Robert Long, of said county.

RESOLVED, That the sheriff, after making the contract as aforesaid, make a return thereof to the treasurer of the western shore, who is hereby directed to pay, in half yearly payments, the amount so contracted for, not exceeding sixty dollars per annum, to the said trustees, or their order. These resolutions to be of no effect, unless the said Robert Long shall notify to the said sheriff that he will no longer support and maintain the said negro at the price heretofore allowed to said Long for that purpose.

RESOLVED, That the state release its interest to the composition or valuation of the land escheated by Arthur Thompson, and Anne Thompson his wife, of Saint-Mary's county.
