A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to establish a bank, and Passed 19th of Dec. 1800. incorporate the subscribers thereto.

THEREAS as it appears by the act of incorporation of the bank, commonly called the Bank Preamble. of Baltimore, that not more than two thirds of the directors in office shall be eligible as directors for the ensuing year, which is found on practice to be very inconvenient; therefore,

C H A P. XXIX.

An ACT for the relief of Thomas M'Cutchen, of Cæcil county.

Passed 19th of Dec. 800.

HEREAS Thomas M'Cutchen, of Cæcil county, emigrated to, and settled in, this state, and Preamble. fince his emigration and settlement as aforesaid has acquired real property therein, and his title to fuch property, from his not having become naturalized agreeably to the laws of the United States, may be called in question, to his great detriment and injury; therefore,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the title to the real property, law- Title rested, fully and fairly acquired by the aforefaid Thomas M. Cutchen, whether such title be derived by gift, &c. grant, purchase or devise, be and the same is hereby as amply and as fully vested in the person aforefaid, to all intents and purposes, as if he had been naturalized agreeably to said laws; provided always, that nothing in this act contained shall in any manner defeat or affect any right, title or claim, to the faid property, or any part thereof, acquired or profecuted by any person or persons whatever before the passage of this act; and provided also, that unless the said Thomas M. Cutchen shall, on or before the first day of June next, proceed according to law to make himself a citizen of

the United States, this act shall have no effect to confirm his title to the property above mentioned,
