

# R E S O L U T I O N S.

**RESOLVED,** That in case of the death, resignation or disqualification, of any of the said commissioners, the governor and council for the time being may and they are hereby authorized and required to supply any vacancy or vacancies so happening, by the appointment of one or more, (as the case may require,) suitable character or characters to discharge the duties aforesaid.

**RESOLVED,** That the governor and council for the time being be and they are hereby authorized and required to make such compensation to the said commissioners so as aforesaid to be appointed, when they shall have discharged the duties and trusts reposed in them as aforesaid, as they shall deem just and reasonable, by orders drawn on the treasury of the western shore, who is hereby authorized and required to pay the same out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

**RESOLVED,** That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the order of his excellency the governor the sum of twelve hundred dollars, to be expended under his direction in the repairs of the government house.

**RESOLVED,** That all proceedings be stayed on a judgment obtained against John Smith Brooks at the suit of the state until the first day of November, eighteen hundred and two.

**RESOLVED,** That the resolution authorizing and directing the treasurer of the western shore to pay annually to each brigade inspector of this state the sum of one hundred dollars as a compensation for his services in discharge of his duty, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-eight, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

**RESOLVED,** That all proceedings be stayed until the first day of November next, on a judgment or judgments obtained in the general court against William M'Mahan, Thomas Cresap, James Scott, Charles Frederick Brod-hag, John Conrod Beatty, George Thistle, Ninian Cochran, George Dent, Thomas Stewart and James Cresap, of Michael, securities of Robert Sinclair, late sheriff of Allegany county.

**RESOLVED,** That the said securities be released from the payment of the nine per cent. interest imposed on them, provided they pay the balance due on or before the said first day of November next, with six per cent. interest thereon.

Whereas the compensation allowed to the trustee under the act respecting the creditors and debtors of this state, passed at November session, one thousand seven hundred and ninety, after the first year, is inadequate to the services required of him, **RESOLVED,** That the said trustee shall be entitled to receive as an additional compensation for his services for the present year the sum of two hundred dollars.

**RESOLVED,** That the treasurer of the western shore pay to the examiner-general of the western shore such sum in addition to his fees for the present year as shall in the whole amount to the sum of three hundred pounds, and the examiner-general shall lay before the next session of assembly the amount of fees by him received in said year, on oath.

**RESOLVED,** That the governor be and he is hereby authorized, by and with the advice and consent of the council, to direct suits to be commenced against such of the debtors to the state as he may think proper, and appoint an attorney or attorneys to any particular suit or suits so directed to be brought; provided, that all debts due to the state shall be paid to the treasurer of the western or eastern shore, and to no other person or persons whatsoever.

**RESOLVED,** That on the application of the governor to the treasurer of the western shore, it shall be the duty of the said treasurer, and he is hereby required, from time to time to furnish the governor with correct statements of the debts due to the state.

**RESOLVED;** That the governor and council be and they are hereby authorized to settle the account of Frederick Green, printer to the state, for printing and binding Kilty's laws, and to draw an order in his favour on the treasurer of the western shore for such balance as they may determine to be due to him.

**RESOLVED,** That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Robert J. B. Parker, the sum of ten dollars and fifty cents, as a compensation for his acting as door-keeper to the senate for three days.

**RESOLVED,** That the several county courts on the western and eastern shore respectively, do, and they are hereby authorized and required, upon the application of Frederick Meddagh, of Frederick county, an old and superannuated soldier of the late American army, to grant him from year to year, during his life, a licence to hawk and peddle, without his the said Frederick Meddagh paying any thing therefor.
