An act for the relief of Stephen Reyner, of Tal-Passed Jan. 7, 1812. bot county.

Benefits of the iesolvent laws granted.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the judges, or any one judge of Talbot county court be, and they, or any one of them, are hereby authorised and directed to extend to Stephen Reyner, the benefit and relief of the act of assembly passed at November session eighteen hundred and five, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the supplements thereto, without compelling him to produce the assent in writing, of so many of his creditors, as have due to them the amount of two thirds of the debts due by him at the time of his application for the benefit of this act, and to extend and afford to the said Stephen Reyner, all the benefits, advantages and provisions of the aforesaid act and the supplements thereto, in the same manner, and upon the same terms and conditions, as if he had obtained the assent of two thirds of his creditors to his release under the same.
