CHAPTER 210.

*An act for the benefit of William McGraw, of Cecil county.*

Passed Jan. 7, 1812.

WHEREAS, William McGraw, of Cecil county, emigrated to and settled in this state, and since his emigration and settlement as aforesaid has acquired real property therein, and his title to such property, from his not having been naturalized agreeably to the laws of the United States, may be called in question to his great detriment and injury; but who has since become naturalized:—*Therefore,*

Preamble.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the title of the real property lawfully and fairly acquired by the aforesaid William McGraw, whether such title be derived by gift, grant, purchase or devise, be, and the same is hereby as amply and as fully vested in the said William McGraw, to all intents and purposes, as if he had been naturalized agreeably to said laws; *Provided always,* that nothing in this act contained shall in any manner defeat or affect any right, title or claim to the said property, or any part thereof, acquired or prosecuted by any person or persons whatever, before the passage of this act.

CHAPTER 211.

*An act to alter the time of the meeting of the General Assembly of this State, and for other purposes.*

Passed Jan. 7, 1812.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the time of the meeting of the General Assembly shall be on the first Monday in December in each year, instead of the first Monday in November, as is now prescribed by the constitution and form of government.

Legislature shall meet on the 1st Monday in December.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the Governor of this state shall be chosen on the second Monday of December in each and every year, in the same manner as is now prescribed by the constitution and form of government; and the council to the governor shall be elected on the first Tuesday after the second Monday of December in each and every year, in the same

Governor and council—when to be chosen.
