CHAPTER 225.

An act for the relief of Alexander Turner, of the city of Baltimore. Passed Jan. 7,
1812.

BE IT ENACTED *by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the judges, or any judge of Baltimore county court be, and they or any of them are hereby authorised and directed to extend to Alexander Turner, of the city of Baltimore, the benefit of the act of Assembly passed at November session eighteen hundred and five, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the several supplements thereto, without requiring the said Alexander Turner to produce the assent, in writing, of two-thirds of his creditors, as is prescribed by the provisions of the said act and supplements. Benefits of the
