

RESOLUTIONS.

1812.
 In favor of Notley Maddox.

Maddox and his securities on a judgment obtained against them on account of a balance due to the state by the said Notley Maddox as sheriff of Prince Georges county be, and they are hereby suspended until the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen; and also that the said Notley Maddox and his securities be, and they are hereby released from the payment of the nine per cent per annum of the fifteen per cent interest, chargeable upon the principal of the balance due the state, on condition only that the said Notley Maddox and his securities shall punctually pay to the treasurer of the Western Shore on or before the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen, the principal of the balance due the state with interest on the same at the rate of six per cent per annum, together with all costs on said judgments; *Provided*, That the judgments shall be in full force and continue, notwithstanding the suspension directed by this resolution; and that if the said Notley Maddox and his securities shall fail in said payment, they shall forfeit the benefit of this resolution, and shall be liable to be proceeded against immediately for the whole of the said debt and cost, and the fifteen per cent interest now payable thereon.

In favor of Isaac Perryman.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Isaac Perryman, of Harford county, or to his order, the sum of fifty dollars as a compensation for the care, trouble and expense of the said Isaac Perryman incurred by him in nursing and maintaining negroes John and Charles, condemned by Queen Ann's county court to work and labor on the public roads in Baltimore county, and who made their escape from Baltimore before they were delivered to the proper officer who was authorised to receive them.

In favor of Kealey Tidings.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto Kealey Tidings, late a sergeant in the Maryland line during the revolutionary war, or to his order, a sum of money, annually, in quarterly payments, equal to the half pay of a sergeant, as a further remuneration for those services rendered his country during the American war.
