3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That if this act shall be confirmed by the General Assembly after the next election of delegates, in the first session after such new election, as the constitution and form of government directs in such cases, this act and the alteration in the said constitution contained therein, shall be considered as a part, and shall constitute and be valid as a part of the said constitution and form of government, to all intents and purposes, any thing therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

*An act for the benefit of Cornelius Ennis, John Hancock and Charity Tarr, of Worcester county.*

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of the levy court of Worcester county shall, and they are hereby directed and empowered at their levy court annually, so long as they shall see cause, to levy on the assessable property of said county, for the support and maintenance of Cornelius Ennis, John Hancock and Charity Tarr of said county, a sum of money not exceeding forty dollars for each of the said persons, and the same, when collected, shall be paid by the collector of said county to each of said persons, or their orders for the purposes aforesaid.
