BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of may open said Maryland, That the levy court of Prince Georges county be, and they are hereby authorised and required to open the road in said county, described in the act to which this is a supplement, according to the directions and provisions of the said act to which this is a supplement; and they are hereby authorised and required to levy on the assessable property in said county, a sum of money not exceeding five hundred dollars, two hundred and fifty dollars of which to be levied annually for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this act and the act to which this is a supplement.
