An act for the relief of Thomas B. Briscoe, of Saint Mary's county.

Benefits of the insolvent laws

1813.

Sec. 1. BE IT ENACTED by the General Asmay be grant sembly of Maryland, That the judges, or any judge of St. Mary's county court, be, and they, or any one of them, are hereby authorised and directed to extend to Thomas B. Briscoe, the benefit and relief of the act of assembly, passed at November session eighteen hundred and five, entitled, an act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, and the supplements thereto, without compelling him to produce the assent in writing of so many of his creditors as have due to them the amount of two-thirds of the debts due by him at the time of his application for the benefit of this act, and to extend and to afford to the said Thomas B. Briscoe, all the benefits, advantages and provisions. of the aforesaid act and the supplements thereto, in the same manner, and upon the same terms and conditions, as if he had obtained the assent of two-thirds of his creditors to his release under the same.
