chattels and effects, of what nature, kind or quality soever; and the same to grant, demise, alien or dispose of; and by the name aforesaid, to do and execute all other things touching the same; Provided, that the clear yearly Provise. value of the real estate of said corporation, exclusive of any house which they may hereafter possess, for the keeping of the books and effects of the society, exceed not the sum of three thousand dollars

2 AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said society, and their successors, by the aforesaid name, shall be forever hereafter, able and capable in law, to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered, defend and be defended, in a y court of record, or any other place whatsoever; and also to make, have, and use a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure; and also to assemble and meet at such times To assembleand places as they may agree upon, and by a majority of enact by-laws, the voices of those attending, to ordain, establish, and &c. put in execution, such by laws, ordinances and regulations, as to them shall seem necessary and convenient, for the government of the society and institution; the

same not being contrary to the laws of this state, or of the United States; and generally to do and execute all such acts, matters and things, as to them shall or may

appertain to do.

Recognized in

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That until there shall be, under this act, an election of officers necessary to the ends of this institution, those now acting, or who may be hereafter appointed to act, under any existing regulations of the society, shall continue so to do, according to the provisions heretofore made; and such regulations shall, till lawfully altered, be deemed as valid and obligatory, as if made since the passing of this act.
